Just come along, meet other gardeners and listen to our speaker.




GREAT WALTHAM FRIENDSHIP CLUB





A120 maintenance works




Your Parish Council and local County Cllr have just been informed by National Highways that the A120 between Stansted and Braintree will be subject to safety barrier renewal and resurfacing which will require overnight closures 3rd Oct to 21st Jan 23 (Westbound) and 7th Feb 23 to 9th (Eastbound). National Grid East Anglia GREEN proposals

Earlier in the Summer I organised a drop-in event in Great Waltham to discuss the RideLondon event which a number of residents had raised concerns about.

Thank you to all those who came along and to those who filled out my online feedback form. Your comments helped to inform my feedback to the event organisers from Ride London and Essex County Council.

Like many of you I have serious concerns about the impact of National Grid's East Anglia GREEN proposals on our local communities. In May I wrote to National Grid regarding the length of time their consultation was open and the lack of early engagement with communities across East Anglia. I also expressed my frustration at the lack of consideration of alternative route options in the consultation. Working with a caucus of neighbouring MPs, representations were made to the Minister for Energy to highlight these concerns in government.

I also had a meeting with the team at National Grid managing the project directly. Since then, to get a good understanding of the logistics of alternative options, I've engaged with representatives of Offset (the Offshore Electricity Grid Task Force) who have been campaigning for an Offshore grid.

I know residents recognise the importance of ensuring our network capability is reliable and can securely transport all the energy required, however this must be done in the right way and ensure as little damage to our countryside as possible.

I want to hear from as many residents as possible with their thoughts on the proposals. Therefore, I have set up a short survey on my website which can be found here: www.kemibadenoch.org.uk/form/national-grid-survey-2022

The Parish Council held a monthly meeting on 15th August. This is a short summary – full and approved minutes are available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

In our public participation session, the chair of the Twinning Association updated us with details of a successful visit to Ceyrat, including the signing of the new treaty and exchanges of gifts and good wishes. In addition, we received a parishioner's written update on the success of the mini-library at Howe Street, and noted feedback on our role in the set-up process.

Mike Steel, our Chelmsford City and Essex County Councillor, confirmed that the next phase of National Grid's East Anglia GREEN enablement project will be walking surveys along the proposed route – we agreed that while not needing to be directly involved in this phase, we will continue to closely monitor all developments. He also asked us to note that the focus of the 20's Plenty campaign for lower traffic speeds could be influenced locally by the pending update to Safer Essex Road Partnership's Functional Route Hierarchy Review, which itself presages a revision of the Essex Speed Management Survey - the level of our future engagement with the campaign and monitoring progress of these reviews will be considered by our newly created Highways and Transport Committee Mike also confirmed that a further RideLondon event has been agreed for 28th May 2023, but that full details, including the precise route, are yet to emerge. We also noted the latest situation in relation to the Bloor

Homes development in Broomfield/Little Waltham where the applications to build 512 new dwellings are reaching their final stages in the approval process.

In noting the range of activities by our handyman, we saw the continuing need to make repairs to parish assets because of vandalism. We maintain a record of costs incurred because of this type of anti-social behaviour. They become an expense we have to factor in when setting our budget, which means either an increase in the parish council contribution we all pay as part of our Council Tax, or a reduction in our spend on worthwhile projects or

- The initiation of arrangements for the parish's litter picking events this autumn was noted.
- A new code of conduct for councillors to align with that recently introduced by the City Council was adopted.
- Opportunities to refurbish the war memorial at Banbury Square were discussed, but we will have to make further enquiries with the War Memorial Trust to fully understand the options available.
- We adopted the proposed terms of reference for the new Highways and Transport Committee, and also agreed minor amendments to the those for the Recreation Committee.
- Our policy document review schedule was noted. We also agreed to pilot a best practice process when submitting agenda items and documents for our meetings.
- We received detailed feedback on the scope and activities of the 20's Plenty campaign (mentioned above) from our councillors who attended a virtual seminar.
- We noted discussions with our landlord for the renewal of our lease of the allotment sites at Brook Mead and Bury Lane have begun.
- Annual maintenance work at Pump Green, North End was agreed.

It was reiterated that volunteers working for the Council (either individually or under arrangements for an organised event) must be authorised and registered as such.

Our next monthly meetings are 17th October and 21st November, with scheduled meetings for our Finance and General Purposes Committee on 24th October and Recreation Committee on 7th November. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend these public meetings Steve Gilbert, Chair
