Remembrance Sunday Parade – 13th November 2022

Great Waltham Parish Council announce that this year's Remembrance Parade and Service will take place on Sunday 13th November.

The parade will follow its usual route, starting at 10.30am from Duffries Close, led by the parade marshal, piper and standards, with representatives of the armed forces, emergency services and community organisations. It will march along Hatchfields to the war memorial via Chelmsford Road, arriving at approximately 10.45am.

The necessary road closures orders have been applied for and traffic will be halted until the parade gets to the war memorial. Chelmsford Road will be closed between the South Street and Hatchfields junctions for the duration of the service, with traffic diverted via Hatchfields and South Street.

Members of the public may join the parade, but must do so at their own risk. We also welcome members of the public and the parish community to join the service at the war memorial. Wreaths will be laid and the last post will be sounded at 11.00am, followed by two minutes silence.

The parade will then move to the church for a service there and afterwards it will reassemble in the church grounds and march past the war memorial for the salute. The Royal British Legion will put on its usual refreshments at the RBL hall after the event.

Waltham Singers Golden Anniversary 1973 - 2023

Our current performing season celebrates our 50 years of singing together. Formed in 1973 by Peter Cross to perform at the Great Waltham Village Festival, the singers enjoyed it so much that they decided to form a choir and continue performing together. The choir grew in confidence under Peter's direction and in 1980 took part in a twinning visit to Ceyrat. The French formed their own choir, and for a number of years there were regular visits in both directions.

In 1983 Andrew Fardell took over as Musical Director. At this time rehearsals and concerts took place in Great Waltham Church. Word started to spread across the choral community in mid-Essex that if you wanted a lively rehearsal and an excellent concert experience the place to be was Great Waltham. Numbers expanded, and rehearsals moved from the Church to the School. Most of the new members were coming from Chelmsford and beyond. Concert venues became more ambitious - Chelmsford Cathedral, Fairfield Hall, Aldeburgh Parish Church, Snape Maltings, Queen Elizabeth Hall, always returning to Great Waltham for our Summer Concert which was always followed by a party - for many years at the home of Anne and Bob Cowlin, and latterly the Village Hall.

When the School had acoustic cladding installed in the Hall we had to give up rehearsing there. We were fortunate to find a venue at St Cedd's School in Chelmsford, which is still our rehearsal base.

The first concert in our anniversary season will be on Saturday 24th November 7.30 pm at Chelmsford Cathedral. We will be performing Mozart's Solemn Vespers and Schubert's Mass in G with 4 excellent soloists accompanied by St. Paul's Sinfonia, who will also perform Mendelssohn's String Symphony No 10.

The Parish Council held a monthly meeting on 26th September. This is a summary – full and approved minutes are available on council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

There was a short period of silence reflection as we recalled the recent deaths of Queen Elizabeth II and two ex-parish councillors, John Bell and Martin Herbert.

There were no members of public present, which was a shame. Always remember, even if you have no specific issues to raise with the Council, you can still come along to listen to our debates and see how your representatives are considering local issues and making decisions on your behalf.

Mike Steel, our Chelmsford City and Essex County Councillor, updated us on his involvement in trying to secure local carriageway repairs. He also highlighted that the proposed diversion route for overnight works on the A120 upgrade includes the B1008 through Ford End. The works will last until February 2023. The Council has written to National Highways to voice its concerns, suggesting an alternate diversion (the letter has been posted on the parish website if you wish to read our representations).

The meeting noted that the public car parking spaces available on the Blossom Way development are subject to terms and conditions under the Council's leasing arrangements with the landowner. One of these prohibits their use by commercial vehicles. We agreed to contact the owners of such vehicles who are using the spaces to make them aware of this restriction.

We also agreed that the Council should offer a response to the City Council's Review of Adopted Local Plan Issues and Options Consultation document, and that it should indicate we are not in favour of any options that include sizable developments in the parish.

We agreed our landlord's proposed terms and conditions for the continued lease of the Brook Mead and Bury Lane allotment sites. We also approved new allotment garden hiring fee charges effective from 1st April 2023.

The Parish Clerk reported that bookings for the hire of the recently refurbished Pavilion at Great Waltham Recreation Ground have been encouraging and we now have a number of different clubs taking advantage of the facility. We agreed that the Council should continue to upgrade parts of the premises in response to hirers' feedback.

The issue of the provision and maintenance of defibrillators within the parish was discussed. We decided that because a number of aspects remain unclear a factfinding exercise should be undertaken so that we are fully informed of the implications were the Council to consider a more active role. Our next monthly meetings are 21st November and 19th December 2022. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend these public meetings. Steve Gilbert, Chair
