Tom Amos Charity appeals for local grant applications

Tom Amos was the village baker who lived and worked in Little Waltham all his life, delivering every day to the surrounding villages. A plaque commemorating him can be seen over The Old Bakery in The Street, Little Waltham. In 1999 he set up The Tom Amos Charity, leaving it the bulk of his estate.

He died in 2003, and since 2009, the Charity has distributed over £870,000.00 to local people and organisations. The objectives of the Charity are the provision of recreational facilities, advancement of education, relief of poverty and advancement of religion and covers Chelmsford C.C. and the districts of Braintree and Uttlesford. The Trustees welcome grant applications from Great Waltham residents and organisations. The website at the base of this article gives details of how to apply.

Parish and City Council - Your vote matters on 4 May 2023

This May, local elections are happening to elect councillors to all wards across Chelmsford City Council, as well as some parishes. Councillors make important decisions about your local area so make sure to vote and have your say! Everything you need to know about the elections can be found at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/elections.

Registering to vote - You need to register before you can vote in UK elections and referendums. You can do this at https://www.gov.uk/register-to-vote. The deadline to register is Monday 17 April 2023. You don't need to re-register if nothing has changed since you last voted, such as your name or address.

<u>Voter ID</u> - You now need to bring photo ID to vote in person. There are lots of different versions of ID that will be accepted, including passports, driving licences, bus passes and blue badges. If you don't have any ID that you can use, you can apply for a voter authority certificate for free before Tuesday 25 April. Visit http://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID.

<u>Postal and proxy votes</u> - If you will be away or can't make it to your polling station on 4 May 2023, you can apply to vote by post or by proxy on the Chelmsford City Council website: www.chelmsford.gov.uk/elections. The deadline for a postal vote is Tuesday 18 April, and the deadline for a proxy vote (appointing someone to cast your vote for you) is Tuesday 25 April.

<u>Could you be a councillor?</u> - If you want to get involved in local democracy, then you can either stand as a representative of a political party or as an independent candidate. The deadline for nominating yourself is Tuesday 4 April. A briefing session will take place in early March. Find out more at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/voting-and-elections/stand-for-election/.

Ford End Gardening Club

Martin Lockwood gave a fascinating talk on the yew tree at our February meeting. The yew tree is one of only three coniferous trees that are indigenous to the UK. The oldest yew tree in the UK is at Fortingall in Scotland and is thought to be between 5,000 and 9,000 years old. It is difficult to count the tree rings as many yews are hollow due to fungus affecting them. The yew tree was sacred to the Celtic people who worshipped beneath them and, when they were converted to Christianity, churches were built close to their sacred trees. Not only has yew wood been used in furniture making but was also used for the longbows of the Middle Ages. The leaves, bark and seeds of the yew are poisonous to humans, cattle and horses but not to badgers, deer and squirrels. However, the red fleshy part of the berry (the aril) is not poisonous but it does contain the poisonous seeds.

At our March meeting on Wednesday 15th, we have Alison Shaw coming to talk about bees and honey.

Do come along to our annual coffee morning and plant sale on the morning of Saturday 22 April and stock up your garden for the summer.

Our monthly meetings start at 7.30pm in Ford End Village Hall and we always look forward to seeing new faces.





An Update from your County Cllr - Mike Steel

Parish and City Council Elections 4 May 2023

This May, local elections are happening to elect councillors to all wards across Chelmsford City Council, as well as some parishes, including Little Waltham. Everything you need to know about the elections can be found at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/elections including how to register to vote, Voter ID (a new requirement – passport, photo driving licence, bus pass, blue badges), how to use a postal or proxy vote.

I am particularly keen to get people to join their Parish Council - find out more at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/voting-and-elections/stand-for-election/. I started 20 years ago and initially combined it with full time work in a demanding job, through retirement, and becoming a City Cllr 4 years ago, and a County Cllr 2 years ago. Being a Parish Cllr can mean as little as just attending 1 meeting a month, or being much more actively involved. It is important to have a full range of experiences and ages.



Traffic Issues:

I am pleased to say that the 40mph buffer zone at the northern end of Ford End has now been installed by ECC Local Highways Panel. Ford End should also be having the kerbs raised at the bus stops. This adds some extra safety to people waiting there. LHP will also be installing improvements to the bend warning signs/lines at Littley Park Cottages, and two 'SLOW' markings.

I deal with a lot issues via my email inbox, and most are to do with carriageway and pavement defects. We have just come to the end of a "Member Led Pothole" scheme where each County Cllr was given an allowance of 36 potholes for priority repair.. I contacted all of my 10 PCs to nominate their worst holes. It seems some County Cllrs did not use all, or any, of their allowance, so I kept submitting them. I have submitted over 80 holes, which are progressively being done. It does mean I have been getting more complaints about roadworks. I have thanked the Highways Cabinet Member for running the scheme and suggested that an equivalent pavement scheme be set up, and he is doing exactly that, with a new member Led scheme of £4M to address more potholes and pavement defects. I will consult with my Parish Councils to select the worst!

2023 RideLondon-Essex

RideLondon will return Sunday 28th May along the same route as last year. This route goes through 3 of the Parish's in my division, but also effects all the others. Because of the issues last year, I insisted on being on the Steering Group and particularly wanted to make sure that the business that were badly affected last year, do not suffer the same issues. More info at ridelondon.co.uk/community-info including how local access will operate. There will be two Public Meeting/Consultations in my division: - 13th March at Writtle College, and a date to be decided at Great Waltham.

Recycling Centres Booking system

ECC have decided to implement a booking system for the Recycling Centres from Monday 13 March. This was a Cabinet decision and I have to admit that I am not fully on board with it! I understand this is to help manage waiting times, reduce congestion, and improve the customer experience. The booking process has already been trialled using the Rayleigh Recycling Centre. I am a member of the Scrutiny Committee that reviews this decision and I will ensure that the decision is well scrutinised. - in terms of benefits and drawbacks (e.g., impact on fly tipping). Some sites do suffer queues, sometimes backing onto major roads. I am told that just applying the booking system to these, could result in residents travelling to other sites and creating queues there. There is no restriction on the number of bookings you can make as long as the waste you are disposing of is household waste. I understand that same day booking will be introduced. Little Waltham Gardening Club

The Down to Earth Community Allotment Project was the title of the February meeting of the little Waltham Gardening Club. Carolin Rogers of the Wilderness Foundation gave an excellent presentation advising that the positive power of wilderness can change lives. We cannot keep taking away from the earth and must give something back. Founded in 1976, the Wilderness Foundation aims to help both young people and children, through local schools, supporting mental health and educating over 6,000 every year on how they can help the environment. As well as their base in Chatham Green, they also have allotments in Melbourne as it's been shown that gardening on a regular basis can reduce stress and increase wellbeing. They have raised beds for wheelchair users and of course are always on the lookout for volunteers. The next meeting of the gardening club is the AGM to be held on 1st March when the club will be 40 years old. Prior to then, we have a flower arranging workshop on the 16th February in readiness for the Spring Show. The annual Spring Show will be held this year on Saturday 8th April. The Hundred Parishes Society

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) recently published analysis of the 2021 Census. Nationally, this showed that the population of England grew by 6% in the last 10 years and 14% over the last 20 years. Locally, the increase has been much faster. The population of The Hundred Parishes in 2021 was around 156,000, up 12% since 2011 and 24% since 2001. If roads seem busier, these extra 30,000 people are a major factor. Half of the increase is accounted for by six parishes close to Stansted Airport. Elsenham, Flitch Green, Great Dunmow, Little Canfield, Stansted Mountfitchet and Takeley have each expanded by more than 50% in the last 20 years. Another big growth was seen in Buntingford: from 4,300 in 2001 to 7,900 in 2021.

Today, 8% of the Hundred Parishes population was born outside the UK (compared to 17% in the whole of England and Wales); 10% of homes are flats (v 22%); 36% of houses have 4 or more bedrooms (v 21%); 27% of homes are rented (v 37%); 40% of adults work at home (v 31%); 55% are in professional or managerial jobs (v 46%); 56% of households have 2 or more vehicles (v 35%).

We have a different age mix to the UK average, with a shortfall of around 5,000 people in their 20s and 30s offset by around 5,000 extra people aged over 40. (Cont'd)

The Parish Council held a monthly meeting on 16th January. This is a summary – full and approved minutes are available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish). The website also includes all of our meeting agendas with their associated briefing/discussion papers and presentations.

This month a member of the public attended to deliver a petition regarding Ford End Recreation Ground and to make representations concerning the related consultation conducted previously by the Council. Because the item was not on the agenda for the meeting, we decided both matters should be discussed in detail at the next Recreation Committee meeting and for the Committee to make recommendations to be considered at the next full Council meeting.

Our county councillor, Mike Steel, updated us on the planned ECC council tax uplift (3.5% overall, compared to the government cap of 5.0%). We were reminded that 45% of the ECC budget is dedicated to the provision of social care, and that for this element ECC has looked to apply the maximum (2.0%) increase it is allowed. Mike also reported that across his area he has submitted 36 applications to repair potholes, with plans to enter more if there are any unused allocations. In addition, he confirmed that ECC funding for the Highways Ranger service (which focusses on minor highways improvements) is to be stopped – if (and how) the service will be supplied going forwards has yet to be fully determined. He also advised that the section of the Chelmsford to Great Waltham cycling route between Goulton Road, Broomfield and Broomfield Hospital has been completed.

The meeting went on to:

- Note that at Great Waltham Recreation Ground the new Hatchfields entrance fencing has been installed.
- Agree the timings for the Spring litter pick events across the parish.
 Reminders of the various dates/locations will be published in Parish
 News
- Amend our Standing Orders to remove gendered titles and pronouns.
- Note this year's 'Play in the Park' event will be on 16th August. We have decided on a single day this year, but with more activities.
- Set up a working group with the remit to report back and recommend an implementation strategy for the Council's provision and maintenance of defibrillators at locations across the parish.
- Agree to fund the costs associated with seeking advice from the City Council planning department to understand whether permissions are necessary to install the small container at Great Waltham Recreation Ground.
- Note the progress made in relation to the Council's action plan (a copy is available on the parish website).
- Approve our Clerk's attendance at an "Election Day" online briefing session in anticipation of the quadrennial parish council elections which will take place this year on 4th May.

Our next monthly meeting are 20th February and 20th March. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend these public meetings. Steve Gilbert, Chair

While the previous paragraph highlights contrasts, some statistics are closely aligned with the national picture: 99% of households have central heating; 5% of households have a second home; 51% of the population is female and 49% male.
