



Memories of Queen Elizabeth ll's Coronation

I was talking with Gerald Smith recently and we were reminiscing about memories of Queen Elizabeths Coronation in 1953. We reflected on the difference of time that 70 years has made.

Gerald Smith remembers Queen Elizabeth Il Coronation in 1953. It was on Tuesday the 2nd June a Bank Holiday. Gerald was 14 years of age, He was living in Howe Street with both his parents and his brother Patrick who was six years of age.

He remembers the occasion very well, His family had a black and white TV and not everybody in Howe Street had a TV, so many of the children and parents came in to watch it in our house. The lounge was packed. It was such a special occasion. Everyone was so excited.

Unfortunately, on that day, it rained continuously and dampened most of the celebrations that were planned. All outside activities were cancelled apart from a firework display for Langleys. A tea was laid on in Great Waltham school for the children late in the afternoon after the Coronation .

The Parish Council held a monthly meeting on 20 th February. This is a summary – full and approved minutes are available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish). The website also includes all of our meeting agendas with their associated briefing/discussion papers and presentations.

Mike Steel, our city and county councillor, updated us on a range of matters including the submission of a new scheme to consider revised school patrol signs at Great Waltham School, the new booking system at local recycling centres, the marked decrease in use of (and therefore income from) many city council administered car parks, and the difficulties which can arise when refugees look to move from their hosts' homes to the private rented sector. We received an update from the organisers on this year's RideLondon event (to be held on 28 th May). This is a significant fundraiser for the charities involved and showcases the best of the Essex countryside. Feedback on the organisation of the 2022 event has been taken into account, with the organisers working with all councils along the route to ensure the event is a success. We will maintain close links with the organisers to pass onquestions and queries we receive from residents. Also, RideLondon will be hosting a drop-in Q&A session at the Pavilion between 5.00pm and 7.30pm on Thursday 6 th April.

In accordance with recommendations from its working group, the Council agreed a strategic approach for the management of public defibrillators in the parish, including working with the Community Heartbeat Trust to supply the units and associated services.

We approved a request from residents for use of the Ford End recreation ground for a community coronation event, and also agreed to contact other parish organisations to see whether they needed any Council support for events they may be planning. The coronation takes place on Saturday 6 th May, with an extra bank holiday on the following Monday.

Following further raised concerns, we discussed the condition of the war memorial at Banbury Square. Because the structure has a Grade 1 listing, carrying out improvement works is not straightforward. We received an update from the Parish Clerk on our ongoing dialogue with the War Memorials Trust whose detailed guidance we must seek and follow. The upshot from their advice is that currently there are some things which can be done straightaway (such as not resting wreathes directly on the stonework as this facilitates the transfer of moisture), but more invasive work must be carefully considered. There is a possibility that the lettering on the memorial could be enhanced using enamel paint, but this too now needs to be thoroughly investigated before we can get approval to proceed. One other aspect more immediately within our gift to address is the condition of the oak posts which form the boundary of the enclosed area around the memorial, and here we agreed to work up a strategy to consider any necessary repairs or replacements.

The purchase of a new multi play unit for the Howe Street recreation ground was approved. The meeting also accepted a proposal to continue development works at Ford End recreation ground in accordance with the results from the most recent consultation.

We agreed to reintroduce having some of our meetings away from the Pavilion so that residents living outside of Great Waltham village have more convenient opportunities to attend.

The Council approved its Highways and Transport Committee's recommendation to support the 20's Plenty for the Essex initiative which seeks the introduction of 20mph speed limits on the county's roads where motor vehicles and pedestrians/cyclists are most likely to encounter each other. We have written to Essex County Council asking it to note our decision. Our next monthly meetings are 20th March and 24th April. As always, all parishioners are most welcome to attend these public meetings.
