



Out of the Blue!

A letter out of the blue from a solicitor in Oxfordshire to the PCC of Great Waltham Church was the first inkling of a generous bequest from the estate of the late Ruby Riches (pictured on the right). And who was this benefactor we asked? Over several days of enquiries around the village and in consultation with the Essex Records Office it became clear that Ruby had arrived in the village in December 1948 as a newly qualified teacher for Great Waltham School following a major national recruitment drive for teachers after WW2. She arrived with her mother and for a time they both lived in Church Housen. However they later moved to The Orchards at Breeds, home of the Dannatt family

where the property was shared. Ruby cycled everywhere and became fully involved in village life, especially the church, singing in the choir and attending the youth club. At the school she loved teaching and in particular art + craft and country dancing. Great Waltham was always dear to her heart despite the fact that, professionally, she moved on to Kings Road Junior School in February 1951 as a result of local school reorganisation.

Whilst moving again in the late fifties to Weymouth and subsequently to Clanfield in Oxfordshire Ruby always kept in touch with Great Waltham and visited the Pepper family every summer for many years. In fact she kept in touch with so many of her former pupils who all remember her with gratitude. Ruby spent the rest of her life in Clanfield and died there last year aged 101.

A happy ending to a sad event

On Sunday 26th February an accidental fire hit North Lodge Cottage at Langleys, leaving a long standing and much loved member of Great Waltham community homeless and stranded.

One of the perks of being a councillor is meeting sections of the community I ordinarily would not meet and being able to help. Introducing the resident to my contacts at LEAP Almshouse Charity meant he was the successful applicant of a Springfield Green almshouse.




LEAP provides secure , safe accommodation for those in need via alms housing in and around Chelmsford. This particular charity, one of 16 charities that LEAP manages, comprises these two one-bedroomed bungalows at Springfield Green (left).

Several trustees met with the applicant (and his dog) and interviewed him to understand more about his present

situation to ensure he would be a good candidate to become a beneficiary of this almshouse charity. The interview took place at Springfield Green so he could see the accommodation. Almshouses, once developed by wealthy benefactors, offer affordable living to those most in need, from the elderly to young couples gathering a deposit for their own home. Most importantly they are offered to local residents as a priority, based on proximity to the dwelling. This enables people within their community, especially when tragedy occurs, to remain amongst friends and loved ones.

The resident clearly was in a very difficult situation, like many of us, struggling with the cost of living and worried about the imminent April rent increase. The trustees felt he would make a worthy beneficiary of the charity and the move was arranged for Saturday 25th March, with the few possessions he saved from the fire.

Stuart lost more than his home in the fire, but thanks to public generosity from gifting necessities, to somewhere to store his tools, he can put the kettle on and relax, ready for the hectic Summer gardening in Great Waltham. Councllor Wendy Daden

The Parish Council's latest monthly meeting was held on 20th March. We welcomed three members of the public who both brought matters to our attention and observed the proceedings. This is a short summary of the meeting, with the full and approved minutes available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish). The latter also includes all of our meeting agendas with their associated briefing/discussion papers and presentations.

In his update for the meeting Mike Steel, our city councillor, advised that the Chelmsford Highways Rangers service as administered by the City Council but funded by Essex County Council is to be discontinued, despite attempts to secure alternative support from within the City Council's own budget. This will mean the tasks the Rangers would have otherwise completed (minor works such as clearing paths, trimming vegetation at the side of the road and cleaning signs) will only get done in future through a more elongated enforcement process. The full practical effects will no doubt become clearer in due course.

We also:

- Acknowledged receipt of a local resident's complaint about the use
 of a bird scarer sited close to the cricket ground, but noted it was
 scheduled to be removed shortly. We deferred a full discussion on
 any possible action until our next meeting.
- Noted that the first two new sets of defibrillator equipment have been ordered from the Community Heartbeat Trust and recorded our thanks to Cllr. Martin for all of his organisational work in reaching this stage.
- Agreed, in relation to the acquisition of a small container for installation next to the Pavilion at Great Waltham Recreation Ground, to submit a full planning application (in accordance with guidance received from City Council planners).
- Reviewed and agreed to adopt a revised petitions policy. The updated version offers much more detail on how residents can raise and submit a valid petition to the Council. The new document can be found on the parish website.
- Noted Great Waltham Village Hall's request for nominations for new trustees at its forthcoming AGM. The Council will consider the nomination of a representative member at its AGM in May (after the election of the new Council), in accordance with the usual timetable for appointing its officers and representatives.

Our next monthly meeting is on 24th April. Following parish council elections on 4th May, the new Council will meet for the first time at its AGM/monthly meeting on 22nd May. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend these public meetings. Steve Gilbert, Chair

North End Spring Tidy-up

The first two attempts at a Spring Tidy-up in North End had to be postponed due to persistent heavy rain and frost. However, we are a hardy bunch and, at the third attempt, the rubbish that had accumulated over the winter was removed from the lanes and ditches. Although it had only been in operation a short time, the effects of the new booking system for the local recycling centres could be seen in the wider selection of items 'discovered'; some of which have proved difficult to dispose of and/or recycle – so we are hoping that this new recycling centre booking scheme will be adapted or abandoned before the Autumn Tidy-up!
