A Message on Bus Travel and DigiGo

I do get complaints about bus services, especially in the rural areas. Most bus services are commercial operations and the operators struggle to put on a service during non-peak hours, or at all, in the more remote areas. How often do you see a bus with hardly anyone on it?

I believe the answer is on demand buses like DigiGo, which is a flexible and shared public transport service with an EV fleet. It's not a taxi or a traditional bus. With no fixed route or timetable, passengers are in control of their journey. Bookings can be made on-demand or up to 7-days in advance via the TravelEssex app. The

service operates flexibly within the operational area – journeys can be made anywhere from one of the thousand virtual stops to another, within the area. Other passengers may be picked up on route to help reduce emissions and congestion. The service is made for everyone... so, whether you're a commuter, a student, a weekend tripper or a key worker, DigiGo can get you to where you're going.


DigiGo is a two year subsidised trial operated by Essex County Council and covers the rural area to the north and west of Chelmsford. It has recently been expanded to come down as far as Broomfield Village Hall.

All single fares are currently capped at just £2! Concessionary bus pass holders travel for free after 9am on weekdays and all day at weekends. It's easy to book a DigiGo journey via the TravelEssex app, www.travelessex.co.uk.

- **Book** Select your pick-up and drop-off points within our operational areas and pay on the app.
- **Track** Watch on your smartphone as your designated vehicle makes its way to you in real-time.
- Ride Hop on and off you go!

If you can't use an app, journeys can be booked via the booking phoneline on 03330 137138, Monday – Friday, between 10am and 12pm (excluding bank holidays). If you have a smartphone but would like support in making bookings via the app and the first few journeys, email us at digigo@essex.gov.uk and we can put in a referral for you to meet with a Travel Trainer. Travel Training is a service that helps support and train people to travel independently on public transport on a one-to-one basis. For more information on the service, visit www.digigo.uk We need this trial to be a success so that it becomes a permanent service. So please make use of it!



A Peal For The King



You may have heard that a national effort is under way by church bell ringers across the country, to celebrate the accession of King Charles, by ringing as many peals as possible during the year following his coronation.

A peal is a major ringing event, for expert ringers; it involves a succession of set sequences and variations, in which each bell changes place with another, a total of 5,040 times, all done from memory, over a period of nearly three hours. A group of visiting ringers will be coming to St John the Evangelist church at Ford End, during July if possible, to ring a peal for the King. It will be wonderful for Ford End to be part of the celebration of such an event, which many of us will be unlikely to see again.

New Multi Play at Howe Street Reacreation Ground

The Parish Council is pleased to report that we have installed a new Multi Play at Howe Street Recreation Ground. Designed for children in the 5–12yr age group it is a welcome improvement to the play area and provides many challenging activities for younger children including a climbing wall, firefighters pole, rope walks and a slide. Last month the Government delivered on its 2019 manifesto commitment to recruit an additional 20,000 police officers by March 2023, in fact they exceeded it.

Delivering on this pledge and keeping our communities safe is one of my key priorities for our constituency. With an additional 500 officers, the largest and strongest force in its 182-years history, and an increased budget of nearly £364 million, they can deliver on the Government's priority to Get Crime Down.

They have already introduced new Town Centre Teams, boosted Neighbourhood Policing, and introduced a new Rural Engagement Team (RET), helping to focus on cutting rural crime, anti-social behaviour in our towns and villages and working to keep local communities safe.

Having recently joined the RET for a police ride-along and having spoken with residents and local farmers during roundtable discussions on rural crime, I know just how valuable these officers are for Chelmsford and Uttlesford.

The Government's Beating Crime Plan and the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act that I voted for in Parliament is also helping to crack down on illegal hare coursing, unauthorised traveller encampments, and gave greater powers to officers to tackle disruptive protests, all concerns that are frequently in my inbox.

However, I am keen to expand on my understanding about how local residents experience and perceive crime, particularly rural crime. Rural crime can have a huge impact on our communities. Too often it goes unreported, and we

need accurate information to reduce crime in our area. It is an important part of bringing forward changes and solutions, which is why I'm encouraging residents to take part in my online rural crime survey, which is now live on my website: www.kemibadenoch.org.uk/kemi-badenoch-mp-rural-crime-survey-2023

I want to hear from residents, local farmers, business owners and anyone who has experienced or has concerns about rural crime in our constituency. I will report back on the results of my survey and work with the local police and authorities to ensure our communities are safe for us all. Parish Defibrillators



The Parish Council recently took the decision for the provision and support of defibrillators within the parish. In addition to supporting the ongoing maintenance of existing units at North End and Littley Green two replacement defibrillators and cabinets have recently been installed at Ford End and Howe Street. The defibrillators are stored in secure cabinets and in the event that one is needed the 999 call handler will direct the caller to the nearest unit and provide the access code.

The first monthly meeting of the new Parish Council was held on 22nd May. You can find more details beyond this short summary in the full and approved minutes available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

We elected our officers for the next 12 months and completed the various governance protocols necessary to continue the Council's work. We welcomed a new member, Cllr Matt Bradley. Because we are now no longer at our full complement of eleven, we agreed to activate our co-option policy, so in due course we hope to welcome three further members.

Mike Steel, our county councillor, outlined the Local Highways Panel budget for proposed works. Although two schemes for the parish were not completed in 2022/23, they have been approved for the new financial year, but dates have yet to be confirmed. They relate to road markings in Littley Park Lane and footway improvements at the junction of Barrack Lane and Cherry Garden Road, Great Waltham.

We noted that the Pavilion at Great Waltham Recreation Ground remains popular and we continue to identify and implement where we can further improvements for its users. We therefore agreed to install a projector-friendly whiteboard to make the venue even more functional.

We made an important decision concerning the longstanding issues in relation to traffic which passes through Ford End. Our data indicates that speeds for almost three-quarters of traffic exceed the 30mph limit, and we estimate that annually 3.4million vehicles use the route. For several years the Council has held a reserve to be used for the installation of an average speed camera system on the B1008 through the village. However, the scheme will cost significantly more than the amount set aside so we established that if the Council raised fifty per cent of the total costs Essex Highways would consider match funding the other half.

At the meeting we resolved to secure a loan to fund the remainder of our portion. Although the vote was split, we now have established a way forward. However, while this was a significant step, things still remain at an early stage as we await the outcome of Highways' consideration of the matter from their side. To provide context, as things stand, we would need to raise a further sum of approximately Given the way our finances work (our income is overwhelmingly derived from the parish precept element of the Council Tax) the repayment of the loan would likely be funded over a period of years by increasing the precept. The scheme's progress and likely impact on the precept will naturally be discussed at future meetings. We also hosted the annual assembly on 5th June at Ford End Village Hall. There were eighteen attendees and the meeting received charity reports from The Great Waltham Charities and North End Charities, and updates from the Twinning Association, Community Network, Horticultural Society, the Walthams Scout Group, city and county councillor Mike Steel, and myself on behalf of the Parish Council.

Our next monthly meetings are on 17th July (at the Pavilion) and 22nd August (at Ford End Village Hall). We also have these committee meetings in July, all at the Pavilion: Recreation Committee on the 12th, Highways and Transport Committee on the 24th, and Finance & General Purposes Committee on the 31st. All parishioners are welcome to attend these public meetings.
