



AUGUST 2023 50m Pylon Plan Returns!

National Grid has launched a second public consultation on their plan to transmit power from the East Anglian offshore windfarms to London. The project is now called **The Great Grid Update Norwich to Tilbury** but, with a few exceptions such as Dedham Vale, it still consists of 180km of 50m high pylons.

Locally, the pylons are proposed to run between Little and Great Waltham, passing closest to Broads Green and the Conservation Areas for both villages. - see map - but their height means that they may well be visible in other parts of Great Waltham village.

Both the public and most local council along the proposed route, including Great Waltham Parish Council, responded to the first consultation with objections plus suggestions for alternative routes and method of transmission. National Grid has produced a Design and Development Report to respond to the route and pylon siting changes but this has resulted in no significant changes in our area. However, this second consultation shows an exact transmission route, including the siting of the pylons.

The organisation Pylons East Anglia is campaigning against the pylons. They have a website www.pylonseastanglia.co.uk which has much useful information about the project, links to the National Grid proposals and advice on responding to the consultation.

Both Essex County Council and Chelmsford City Council will respond to the National Grid proposal, as will the Parish Council. Members of the public can also give their feedback on these proposals to National Grid but the period for consultation ends on **21**st **August.**

Recently, the Electricity Systems Operator (ESO) announced that it would launch a 'Study' to assess objectively the options for Norwich to Tilbury and other proposed network reinforcements across East Anglia. We understand that



the Study will consider the costs and deliverability of the different options, which will include the offshore option. National Grid have stated that if the recommendations from the ESO Study should indicate alternative infrastructure options, they will review and engage with the impacted communities appropriately. After this consultation and following the completion of the ESO Study there will be a further stage of consultation next year, where National Grid aim to show finalised proposals.

From the Vicarage

Research led by the Chelmsford Food Alliance highlighted the increased food poverty locals are facing. One significant discovery was that the needs are not centralised but rather they are popping up all over the place. Foodbank is a necessary



and extraordinary resource for those facing hard times. For many however the cost-of-living crisis has not left them totally without food, so much as it has put greater pressure on their shopping bill. It's this that has led to the provision of St Francis Pop Up Foodstore. This is a project of the Gracefields group of churches and supported by City and County Council, Feeding Britain and others.

Our aim is to "Pop up" in neighbourhoods that struggle with access to amenities, offering a more affordable food alternative once a week.

We operate a membership system where you sign up for £10 and receive a membership bag which needs to be brought along each time you shop. From then on, it is £5 a week to fill your bag with around £20-30 worth of food. There are limits on how many items from each table you can take, and we are not a supermarket so cannot guarantee your favourite products each week!

Membership is not means tested. Anyone can shop with us, and we can currently be found at **Ford End Village Hall every** <u>Tuesday morning 9-11am</u>. Please come along and chat to find out more, there's no hard sell to sign up!

Elaine announced that the recent auction successfully boosted funds and Pauline Wilson was welcomed as a new member



Allotments Maintenance Contract

The Parish Council is seeking a contractor to undertake seasonal grass strimming and mowing work on agreed areas at its allotment sites, under the direction and supervision of its Allotment Supervisor.

The contractor will be required to supply all equipment used. The role will also extend to covering any unhired plots pending their rehire, with the Council providing all materials. Other works (such as hedge cutting or lopping tree branches) may also occasionally be required. The contractor must hold public liability insurance for claims up to £10m.

This is a summary of discussions at the latest monthly meeting of the Parish Council held on 19th June. For more details, see the full and approved minutes available on Council noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

Two planning applicants attended to provide us with firsthand information concerning the works being proposed for their properties – we welcome applicants at our meetings as this always gives us a better appreciation of the changes being proposed as we decide on our comments as a consultee in the process. We noted that our own planning application for a small storage container at Great Waltham Recreation Ground has been granted, and that the process of purchase and installation is to begin. In addition, we noted the upcoming City Council Planning Committee discussion in relation to the link road associated with the Bloor development at Broomfield/Little Waltham. We also agreed to send a representative to an exhibition on 20th June in relation to the proposal for an integrated retirement community (of 205 apartments/suites) at Blasford Hill, Little Waltham.

This month, city councillor Mike Steel confirmed that a new member led pothole repair scheme will begin soon – let a Parish Councillor or the Clerk know if you wish to report one. He also updated us on Digigo (the fully electric shared public transport service which offers on-demand or pre-bookable travel) – the facility is popular, but volumes are not yet at levels to make it sustainable in the long-term, so without using it, we may lose it. We also noted that Essex County Council has launched a consultation on a new Essex Electric Vehicle Charge Point Strategy – it closes on 30th July (see the website: www.essexhighways.org/ev-strategy).

We agreed our Recreation Committee's recommendation to initiate a working group to develop plans and strategies for the Great Waltham Recreation Ground play area – some of the items of equipment which have served us so well are beginning to show their ages, so we need to decide what action to take. At Ford End Recreation Ground, in addition to noting the installation of the new path (as agreed at previous meetings), we resolved to apply for a Locality Fund grant for a new seat. At Howe Street Recreation Ground, we noted the new multi-play equipment has been installed and is ready for use.

We have obtained estimates for the limited renovation work we are permitted to undertake on the war memorial at Banbury Square (essentially enamelling the inscriptions to make them all legible), but members wanted more information on how the appearance would be altered – this is not an easily reversible process, so we want to get it right. The item will be discussed again at the July meeting when more intelligence has been gathered.

The Council also agreed to purchase computer software to allow us to introduce and operate a paperless, cloud-based operating system for our administrative functions. This will not only free up resource but also improve data accuracy, move us away from reliance on unsupported software, and offer the opportunity for more professional looking communications.

Our next monthly meeting is on Tuesday 22nd August at Ford End Village Hall. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend our public meetings.
