#### **Spring Update:**

The surgery has implemented a new phone system across both sites and now offer a call back service. The phone lines are still extremely busy, but we aim to have 3 receptionists at site, especially during the morning rush at 8am. The surgery is pleased to announce that the E-consult booking system seems to be working well for making routine appointments. To access the E-consult system go to the surgery website - and click the online consultation button; fill out the form which will be sent automatically to the surgery. It will be triaged, and you will either receive a phone call or a booking link. The phone booking system is available for urgent cases that need to beseen on that day or for people unable to access the online service.

Work continues with the new design for the website making it clearer and simpler to use.

LW&GN PPG, other PPGs and representatives from local Parish Councils have met to discuss the level of local development alongside proposed healthcare provision and are collectively in contact with the Integrated Care Board to clarify the situation. We will keep you updated.



#### Year 5 Pupils become Mental Health First Aiders

Pupils at Ford End (part of LIFE Education Trust)are part of a new Trust-wide initiative to educate pupils about mental health and provide them with opportunities to take positions of responsibility to support younger students in mental health matters. Year 5 'LIFE Ambassadors' from eight Trust primary schools have recently undertaken mental health first aid training to learn; what affects our mental health, how to spot signs of being unwell and what can help. The children attended 6 hours of training over 3 sessions and have completed the course in time to lead activities for <u>National Children's Mental Health Week</u> in each of their schools from Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February.

To launch the week, all children and adults were asked to wear 'things that make them happy' on the first day, to help raise awareness of the

importance of mental health in everyone. Following this, Ford End enjoyed a range of wellbeing activities during the week including 'going for a walk' to get some exercise and take in the world around them with their peers and 'a screen-free afternoon' to encourage good habits and highlight the mental health dangers of too much time spent on devices.

The Pupil First Aiders ongoing role in school will then see them become the 'go-to person' for anyone who is going through some form of mental health issue. They will be able to guide the student in distress to get the help that they need and also look out for or spot anyone in distress. Their role is not to fix the problem, but to support peers with self-help strategies or signposting them. They will also inform trusted adults in the school of any concerns.

# A few updates from your County Cllr – Mike Steel

DigiGo is extending the service beyond the pilot for an extra 2 years! DigiGo is a fully electric shared public transport service which offers on-demand or prebookable travel in parts of Essex. There is no fixed route or timetable, which puts you in control of your

journey. DigiGo is booked through the TravelEssex journey planning app. Digigo covers much of my Broomfield and Writtle Division and extends into the northern part of Writtle. DigiGo operates 7 days a week, from 7am until 10pm. Fares are capped at £2 per journey, or concessionary passes apply. www.digigo.uk

Digigo are also reaching out to parishes to introduce a series of in-person app support sessions called 'Enhance your Digital Confidence with DigiGo.'. The sessions specifically focus on providing digital support for those less digitally inclined, guiding them through the process of using the TravelEssex app and making DigiGo bookings via

it. They envision hosting these sessions either in conjunction with existing parish meet-ups or coffee mornings or as standalone events at a parish or community building. Let me know if a group want me to set one up.

#### National Grid (NGET) – Pylons

ESO (separate to National Grid Electricity Transmission) have begun their study which will analyse onshore and offshore options. The review, which will be part of the ongoing Norwich to Tilbury pylon proposals, will take around 3 months and more information on its scope can be found here: http://www.nationalgrideso.com/.../offs.../east-anglia-study

#### Essex Highways crews tackle Storm Isha:

Highways crews worked throughout the night dealing with flooding, wind damage and fallen trees as Storm Isha arrived. They received 70 reports for weather-related incidents, including reports of flooding and fallen trees. Working with partners Essex Police and UK Power Networks, 20 serious issues were dealt with quickly by crews overnight to help get the roads across Essex moving again.

This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the January meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, full and approved minutes of all Council meetings are available on our noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

Members of the public told us about several incidents of criminal damage. Although the Chelmsford & Maldon Community Policing Team were unable to attend on the night, we hope to put the points made to them when they come to our February meeting, which I will report on next month. The Council itself has not been immune from acts of vandalism to its assets, and as I have mentioned previously, the costs for repairs and replacements ultimately come from our Council Tax payments.

We also received representations from a member of the public concerning our provision of allotment garden amenities, and we agreed to add an agenda item to a future meeting to discuss all the issues raised.

We agreed positioning statements in relation to the Ford End average speed camera scheme - these can be found on the parish website. We continue to look to engage with Essex Highways and again I will provide updates in my future meeting summaries. Despite Highways' being unable to support the scheme financially, we agreed that because in our view the weight, volume and speed of vehicles using the B1008 through Ford End village continues to present a risk to pedestrians and other road users, we will continue to lobby for road safety improvements.

We agreed that, in consultation with the Community Network, we would investigate the purchase of new Christmas tree white lights for the tree on Banbury Square. We also decided that, subject to conditions, an anti-pylons banner could be displayed on the green at Broad's Green.

Our next monthly meetings are on Tuesday 19th March 2024 at Ford End Village Hall and Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2024 2024 at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend our public meetings.
