## Great Waltham continue to fly high

Despite a very wet summer, it was another successful cricket season for Great Waltham, with a number of notable achievements.The Club continues to provide opportunities for all ages, genders and abilities with Monday nights through the summer dominated by the 'next generation' of young players being put through their paces in fun training sessions led by a team of qualified coaches.

The Club has teams entered into a number of different age group competitions with regular softball and hardball fixtures.The Ladies XI repeated their achievement of the previous season by reaching the 2023 finals day of the Essex Women's T20 League. With the original fixture falling victim to the




weather, the rearranged final against Sudbury CC took place at the end of the season with Great Waltham coming up just short in an exciting encounter that was a great advert for the Women's game.

The Sunday XI, with a healthy mix of emerging talent secured promotion from Division 2 of the Warsop Sunday League in an unbeaten season. Once again, the Midweek T20 side, reached the final of the Geoff Newman Trophy but came up short in a close encounter with Hatfield Peverel CC.

On a Saturday, the 2nd and 3rd XI's enjoyed mixed fortunes in Divisions 3 and 9 of the T Rippon Mid-Essex Cricket League whilst the 1st XI came agonisingly close to achieving their first Premier Division title since 1998, falling just short with a narrow defeat in a winner-takes-all contest on the final day of the season.

Led by captain Josh Fitzwater, the team is dominated by players that have grown up in the village and progressed through the Clubs Junior cricket system into the Senior sides. There were individual accolades for Ollie Fitzwater who scored the most runs (710) in the Premier Division and Matthew Reed who took the most wickets (34). It was a landmark season for the Club as they hosted a County fixture for the first time



in their history as an Essex Over 50's side took on their counterparts from Gloucestershire. (Continued on page 3)



When the first village Art Show took place in 1972, it would have been hard to imagine that this annual event would have been happening over 50 years later.( it had to be cancelled for two years due to Covid).

That first show - part of ' the Great Pageant ' -was a comparatively modest event, held in Great Waltham Village Hall to raise money to extend the hall. As it still is today, the show was set up and run by local volunteers -nowadays around 40 invaluable people.

The show eventually outgrew the hall and moved to its present location -Great Waltham Parish Church.These beautiful surroundings create a unique atmosphere for exhibitors and visitors who appreciate the ancient architecture, background music from the grand piano, artists in residence and refreshments featuring delicious homemade cakes. All for £1 admission fee.

The Art Show attracts an eclectic range of work from local artists and beyond. This year expected to be around 300 entries to view and buy. As always, any money raised will go to village organisations. Last year it was  $\pounds1,200$ .

The fiftieth Great Waltham Art Show is on Saturday 4th from 12.00 and Sunday 5th of May from 12.30. Do come along. If you have been before you will know that it is always an enjoyable and rewarding experience - as it has been for half a century.

This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the February meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, full and approved minutes of all Council meetings are available on our noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

We received a presentation from the Chelmsford and Maldon Community Policing Team on current policing priorities and issues in the parish. The parish's reported crime statistics are collated as part of a wider area, but we were able to get an understanding of local trends (more details are included in the minutes of the meeting, available on the parish website). Details of the Essex Police Force Plan 2022 to 2025 available online are at https://www.essex.police.uk/police-forces/essex-police/areas/essexpolice/au/about-us/essex-police-force-plan-2022-25/.

We discussed a trend in locally-focussed social media for the posting of negative and intrusive comments. Although the Council does not host any social media sites itself, we encourage users to avoid uninformed remarks and site administrators to continue to monitor for this type of content. More generally, we agreed to post details of how one can raise concerns about the Council's or other local authorities' services.

In addition we:

- Agreed to replace the play area gates at Great Waltham Recreation Ground and to commission the works necessary to follow the recommendations of a recent tree survey.
- Agreed the dates for various parish litter-picking events.
- Noted that we had received no comments following the previous article in Parish News on the proposed renovation work to the war memorial at Banbury Square – we will post the article on social media and on flyers at the location to make sure everyone has had a chance to comment.
- Resolved to purchase a hand dryer at the Pavilion and also to investigate the cost of introducing wi-fi facilities there.
- Noted generous requests to donate two new benches to the parish – we will progress with the work needed for installation.
- Agreed to progress with the proposed installation of a new defibrillator unit at Broad's Green, where again we will work through the mechanics of making this happen.

Our next monthly meetings are on 22<sup>nd</sup> April and 20<sup>th</sup> May 2024, both at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend our public meetings. We will also be hosting the parish's Annual Assembly on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> May at Great Waltham Village Hall.
