50th Great Waltham Art Show

This year was a special occasion for the Art Show since it was its 50th Anniversary. The Great Waltham Community Network sponsored the show this year which included a celebratory buffet for artists and helpers on the Friday evening and a presentation to Diane Hughes (left) who has been a mainstay of the show for most of the fifty years. The show was attended by a record number of people this year with 350 attendees over the weekend. A record number of sales was achieved totalling in excess of £3000. All the profit from the show is

donated to village organisations namely; church, school, village hall and Community Network. Important as it is to raise money for village organisations, the show is a significant event in the life of the village, bringing people together to spend an hour enjoying viewing

artwork in a beautiful setting. It could not happen without the help of a considerable number of people, including the many helpers, cake makers, hangers, committee members, artists and of course the many people from the village and surrounding area that attend the show. MEMORIES OF D-DAY 6/6/1944 - On the 80th Anniversary

A few months ago, the British Legion asked readers of our Parish News for any family stories/memories of D-Day, the beginning of the liberation of German-occupied Europe (called Operation Overlord) which brought about the end of the Second World War in 1945.

This struck an emotional chord with me as my Dad (Bob) was in the RAF dropping American paratroopers over Normandy on D-Day. He had joined the RAF in 1941 and was a wireless operator on a Stirling Bomber with a crew of 8 and many American paratroopers when Dads's plane was shot down over Caen. They were trying to crash land but



hit the top of a tree and the aircraft broke in two – Dad and the Rear Gunner Bert were in the tail and survived the crash but with bad injuries. Those crew in the front all died with some of the American paratroopers.

The Germans took the survivors prisoner. Bert was sent to Paris for treatment. Dad was treated by an excellent German doctor who saved his leg. Eventually Dad was sent to a Prisoner of War camp in Bankau where he spent a year. In early 1945 the POWs heard the Red Army were nearing their camp (The Russians were our allies at that time!). The Germans forced all the POWs to march miles in terrible weather conditions to the next POW camp (Stalag Luft IIIA). This march began on 19/1/1945 and they reached the next camp on 8/2/1945. They slept in barns and cowsheds and a brick factory in temperatures of minus 13 degrees and snowstorms. Dad said 14 went missing during this time.

The Russians eventually liberated all POWs in Stalag Luft IIIA and Dad was repatriated to England in July 1945, where my mother waited anxiously. They married 6 months later and 4 years on I arrived followed by my brother to complete Dad's lovng family.

Dad had a happy life thereafter with his family and friends – and lots of whisky! And lots of laughter can you believe! He could still laugh after suffering all that horror, aged 23. But he

never forgot his lost comrades – he visited their graves in Ranville cemetery, and never missed the Remembrance services at the Cenotaph.We are very proud of our Dad. Bless him and all who served. 

Summer Update:

Welcome to the latest news from the Surgery.

Firstly, due to high demand at 8am and to make it fair for all patients the decision has been made by the GP Partners, that from the 13th of May between the hours of 8am and 9am we will no longer accept walk-ins to make appointments. You will need to call or use the online consultation.

To evaluate the accessibility and ease of the online booking system we will be running a short survey available for completion when accessing the surgery.

Secondly, if you receive a text message saying you are due your Spring Covid booster, please be advised that they are not available at the surgery. To book your booster please go to <u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/covid-19/covid-19-vaccination</u> and click on 'Getting a Covid 19 Vaccine'.

We are sure many of you are as concerned as we are over the high level of housing development in our area alongside the provision of healthcare facilities. To this end we have held a meeting with the Integrated Care Board to help clarify the situation and are now planning to hold a workshop with the ICB and representatives from healthcare providers and Parish Councils to see how we can work together to address the situation. If you are interested in attending the workshop, then please check the surgery website under the PPG tab where the date of the workshop will be made available.

Unfortunately, we are experiencing delays with finalising the design of the new website but hope to have it up and running shortly. 

We have had a busy start to the Summer Term!



Review of the Chelmsford City Council Local Plan – update from your

Chelmsford City Cllr, Mike Steel

The Local Plan shapes future growth and development across Chelmsford City Council's area. It sets out a positive vision, identifies where and how new development should take place in the future as well as areas for protection. City Council adopted the current Local Plan in May 2020, and need to review the plan at least every five years to make sure it remains up to date and meets the changing needs for development growth to 2041. The proposal includes 2 new sites in Ford End - 14a, Land west of Back Lane - 20 homes,

and 14b Land south of Ford End Primary School - 20 homes. I was expecting 14b, but 14a was a surprise! The consultation runs from Wednesday 8 May 2024 to 4pm on Wednesday 19 June 2024. Please make your comments if you want to influence this. City Council will consider all responses received and use them to inform the next stage of the process, the Pre-Submission Local Plan. Responses will be published on the Council's Consultation Portal in accordance with the Data Protection Act and General Data Protection Regulations.https://www.chelmsford.gov.uk/media/uc3hwklj/local-plan-newsletter-may-2024.

This is a summary of some items discussed at the April meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings, available on our noticeboards and the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

This month the Pavilion was packed as many members of the public attended, principally to make representations and hear our discussions on two particular topics – National Grid's pylons proposals and plans for possible housing developments in Ford End. There is insufficient space here to detail all the points raised (however, the full minutes will be available online to review), but the upshot was that:

- On the former, we agreed to both take account of the comments offered when we submit our response to NG's statutory consultation and host a further pylons community meeting (now arranged for 30th May at Great Waltham Village Hall).
- For the latter, we would again consider comments made when we respond to Chelmsford City Council's consultation on its draft Local Plan for housing.

The Council encourages all parishioners to make their own responses to both consultations if they also wish their individual views, comments, objections etc. to be noted. In particular, we noted the low percentage response rate to NG's two previous non-statutory consultations, so the more responses submitted this time, the louder the collective voice. Also at the meeting we:

- Discussed the Parish Paths Partnership scheme offered by Essex Highways and agreed to support our participation if a local volunteer force can be mustered.
- Agreed to set up a working group to consider the issues which have emerged in relation to the village green at the southern end of Church Lane, Ford End.
- Discussed the damaged (and subsequently missing) dog waste bin on South Street, Great Waltham and agreed to purchase a replacement as soon as possible.

The next monthly meeting will be on Tuesday 18th June at Ford End Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. As always, all parishioners are welcome to attend our public meetings. Steve Gilbert, Chair
