

Ellis Wild Charity Car Show 2024

TMFIT, along with The Hub, hosted the Ellis Wild Charity Car Show on Sunday 15th September at Warners Farm. The Car Show ran for the first time last year with the aim to raise money to get Ellis from Writtle, to Italy, for crucial treatment for stage 4 Neuroblastoma.



Heartbreakingly, Ellis lost his courageous fight in October 2023, aged just 6 years old.

It felt important to continue supporting Ellis's family and so TMFIT aims to run the event annually in his name.

The Car show hosted a huge range of cars, from vintage classics such as Rolls Royce, Frogeye Sprite and a XK 120 Jag, to modern Ferraris, Aston Martins and Porsches. The variety of vehicles, enhanced by the GB Finch bespoke sprayed truck, a huge drag bike and a war jeep with all the memorabilia, made for an impressive display.MASSIVE THANKS to all the volunteers who helped run the event, all the local businesses who donated raffle prizes, to those who displayed their cars and for everyone who came along to purchase bacon baps, raffle tickets and empty their change into the donation buckets!



Remembrance Sunday - 10th November 2024



The parade will follow its usual route, starting from Duffries Close at 10.30am, led by the parade marshal, piper and standards, with representatives of the armed forces, emergency services and community organisations. It will march along Hatchfields, into Chelmsford Road to the war memorial, arriving there at approximately 10.45am.

The necessary road closure orders have been secured and traffic will be halted to get the parade safely to the war memorial for a short service. Chelmsford Road will be closed between the South Street and Hatchfields junctions for the duration of the service with traffic diverted via Hatchfields and South Street.



Members of the public may join the parade, but must do so at their own risk. We also welcome

members of the public and the parish community to join the service. Wreaths will be laid and the last post will be sounded at 11.00am, followed by two minutes silence.

The parade will then move to the church for a service there and afterwards it will reassemble in the church grounds and march back past the war memorial for the salute when Chelmsford Road will be briefly re-closed. The Royal British Legion once again invites the church congregation to the RBL hall for refreshments after the event.





FORD END GARDENING CLUB

At our October meeting, which was very well attended, Stephanie Callister-Jarrold gave us a talk on rescue owls and birds of prey and had some wonderful slides of the birds that had been brought to the Owls and Birds of Prey Rescue. This is a charitable organisation run by Stephanie and based in Gestinthorpe on the Essex/Suffolk borders where it operates to look after injured and orphaned owls and birds of prey prior to release back into the wild wherever



possible. The owlets(left) are used to being in a nest with siblings that they snuggle up to so when an injured or abandoned one arrives and is put in a cage it is given a teddy bear for company and we saw delightful slides of owlets cuddling up to one. The information that Stephanie gave us on the different species of

owls found in our countryside was really fascinating. Although the rescue owls are happy to be in a cage with other ones, the birds of prey need to be kept separate from each other as they will attack any bird put with them.

We are looking forward to Stephanie giving a Hedgehog Haven Talk at our next meeting on the 20 November. This starts at 7.30 in Ford End Village Hall and everyone is welcome to join us.

This is a summary of some items discussed at the September monthly meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings, available on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

As no members of the public attended on this occasion they missed an opportunity to hear from our local Community Policing Team on current policing priorities and issues in the parish. Members indicated that increased visibility of officers generally and more speed checks would be well received.

Mike Steel, our city and county councillor, highlighted that Essex Highways' 'Tell Us' tool (for reporting highway defects) on the website has been improved – a user can note if the defect is getting worse and photos loaded by other members of the public are available to view. Mike also confirmed there will be no RideLondon event in 2025, but a revamped event is planned for 2026.

We approved the Council's response to ECC's Local Transport Plan consultation. We also agreed we would consider and look to support grant applications from organisations in the Parish who wish to arrange events for next year's 80th anniversary of VE Day. In relation to the Great Waltham Recreation Ground play area project, we noted the intention to run a consultation event at Great Waltham school to get the views of the experts – the children who will use the equipment – and to run an online survey to collect more ideas.

We agreed in principle to renew the public car parking space rental arrangement with the Village Hall, subject to negotiation and agreement of terms and conditions going forward

We decided not to pursue the self-funding option we had investigated for the introduction of a Quiet Lane scheme through Ringtail Green – it was felt the indicative costs of £15,500 could not be justified. We then resolved that despite our efforts the current situation in the area should be accepted and that we would not consider other measures to address traffic issues at Ringtail Green.
