# UKRAINE **EMERGENCY APPEAL**

Thank you for taking the time to read this circular. You may already be aware of the work our organisation is doing with the Revival Centre in Chemihiv and other areas within Utraine Indeed some of you may already be supporting us, for which we sincerely thank you.

The situation in Ularine is worsening. On our lost visit a couple of weeks ago we sensed that some people are beginning to lose hope; their strength being severely tested by the constant bombardment day in and day out.

Now, more than ever, farmers are finding it harder to grow their crops of wheat and vegetables due to a combination of overhead bombing and their fields being mined. Food is becoming scarce and, when available, ever more expensive.

We are planning for our next trip to Ukraine at the end of May and our biggest priority will be food and medical aid. We want to take tinned and dried food with a long shelf life (up to 6 manths) and we would be so grateful for any donations you can give - no matter how small



This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the March meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

We heard from members of the public regarding the on- and offroad parking situation in Cherry Garden Road, Great Waltham, and in particular how pavement parking affects access to driveways and that driving across and parking on the greensward areas causes damage to the grass. We noted that the Parish Council has no powers over highway matters or those concerning the use of land owned by others (in this case Chelmsford City Council or Chelmer Housing Partnership (CHP)). However, we resolved to set up a working group under our Highways and Transport Committee with invited noncouncillors to fully identify the issues and recommend any lobbying actions.

We have agreed our response to the latest National Grid targeted consultation regarding the use of pylons across the parish. We have expressed our disappointment that our comments made in response to the previous statutory consultation have been ignored, and that the latest proposals are no better (if not worse) than the previous ones. A copy of our response has been posted on the parish website. We also agreed to submit a response to the Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government's Greater Essex devolution consultation, and again this is posted on the website.

Having been asked to discuss the possibility of facilitating the installation of a Great Waltham village sign, we did so even though no-one attended to back the idea. Because the Council currently has no budget for this work, without any additional public support, we agree to close this item.

Please note that from April our meetings will start a half-hour later at 7.30nm

The next monthly meeting (combined with our AGM) will be on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> May at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground, starting at 7.30pm. As always, all are welcome to attend our public meetings. Steve Gilbert Chair
