LITTLE WALTHAM GARDENING CLUB - May 2025

Members enjoyed a presentation entitled 'Right Plant, Right Place' by Charlotte Power, Horticultural lecturer at Writtle College. The many factors that determine where a plant should be placed were discussed. Drainage and PH of the site are important as is space. How many times do we see an enormous (say), Monkey Puzzle tree dominating a small garden to the exclusion of other plants? Then there is the damage that roots can cause to buildings, willow and bamboo being good/bad examples. There's no such thing as a dwarf conifer warned Charlotte. Some maybe slow growing, but left to themselves they will eventually grow to their unanticipated

It was not all gloom and doom. If the soil is alkaline, go with the flow and grow Lilacs, Ceanothus, Clematis and Berberis, to name but a few, and leave the rhododendrons and azaleas and Camellias to those with acid soil. 'Enjoy your garden and don't forget to plant so that the view from inside the house is attractive and tempts you away from household chores' was Charlotte's message.

Until September 3rd, the Gardening Club's meetings will take the form of afternoon outings: May 14th 'Peacocks', Margaretting. June 4th Feeringbury Manor; July 1st 'Dragons'; August 6th RHS Hyde Hall. We travel by car and lifts can be arranged.







We know that being outside is good for our wellbeing, both mental and physical. Besides the open countryside, we are fortunate in The Hundred Parishes to have parks and gardens where we can walk, sit and enjoy nature. I will mention just a few.

Bridge End Gardens in Saffron Walden was created by a local businessman and Quaker, Francis Gibson, in the 1840s. It is now managed by Saffron Waldon Town Council. Delights to explore include the hedge maze, rose garden and Dutch garden.

The Gardens of Easton Lodge in Little Easton have limited opening hours which can be found on our website www.hundredparishes.org.uk. They were designed by Harold Peto in 1902 for the Countess of Warwick who lived at Easton Lodge.

In Sawbridgeworth, Pishiobury Park was redesigned by Capability Brown in the 18th century as an enclosed park. It is a registered historic park and includes wet woodland, grazed fields, an oak walk, meadows and part of the River Stort.


Birchanger Wood comprises 69 acres of ancient coppiced woodland, managed and owned by the Birchanger Wood Trust. Three miles of all-weather, wheelchair-friendly paths make it easy to explore.

In Stansted Mountfitchet, the Aubrey Buxton Nature Reserve is a 25 acre woodland with six man-made ponds. It was originally part of the park and garden of Aubrey Buxton's house. He was a co-founder of the World Wildlife Trust and donated the land to Essex Wildlife Trust. Today you can enjoy circular walks passing the ponds through the wood.

June is the month when many private gardens open to the public, even groups of gardens in Duxford and Ickleton – details appear on the What's On section of our website.

We hope you enjoy the summer and explore some of our wonderful parks and gardens.

This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the April meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

Our city and county councillor, Mike Steel, confirmed that higher authorities too have submitted responses to National Grid's latest targeted consultation on its proposed scheme of a pylon route through East Anglia. It was noted that in its submission one option proposed by Chelmsford City Council was a relocation of the route to the north of Great Waltham and Little Waltham. The meeting recalled that the Parish Council's current position is to oppose the installation of pylons anywhere in the parish.

We discussed the apparent increase of Aldi's use of the B1008 by its HGVs. We noted that in a communication from its local transport manager Aldi had confirmed, *inter alia*: "we [do] use B roads to make our way from our RDC's [Regional Distribution Centres] to our stores" and although there is unhappiness "that we use the B1008, the use of that route does reduce our carbon footprint by over 100 tonnes annually". We decided to contact Aldi again to challenge this saving amount and to suggest that despite its greater length average overall carbon emissions per mile may be no more, or indeed less, when using the alternative A131/A120 route.

We also agreed expenditure to: purchase an electric sprayer to paint the exterior walls of the Pavilion; clear a blocked drainage pipe at the Pavilion (caused by tree root ingress); and support the purchase of a banner for parish organisations at their events, beginning with the scouts' breakfast event on Sunday 1st June.

The next monthly meeting will be on Monday 16th June at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground, starting at 7.30pm. As always, all are welcome to attend our public meetings.
