





TruCam - Coming to a lay-by near you The problem of speeding motorists has seen the Parish Council's involvement in a number of measures over recent years (some more successful than others), and in our continuous search for solutions to make our roads and footways safer for residents we are pleased to report on



our latest initiatives. We have entered an arrangement with Maldon District Council (MDC) to operate their TruCam equipment in the parish. TruCam is a hand-held speed detection device with video recording capability. The captured video evidence and speed readings are used by the police to support Notices of Intended Prosecution. Starting in June trained MDC



personnel will begin operating the system in the parish. In addition, we have set up our own reporting system to capture details of traffic related incidents in the parish. We hear about events after they have happened, often via social media, but to help build a better picture that could help us argue for traffic calming initiatives we need your help. When you become aware of road traffic collisions or other vehicle related incidents that lead to road

closures or hold-ups in the parish, please use either of the following links to provide us with brief details: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ZGW95N7 These new initiatives join a list of earlier efforts we have made to try and reduce the speed and volume of traffic through our villages and hamlets. These are some of our other activities:

- We continue to look for ways to implement average speed cameras in Ford End village.
- Our portable Speed Indicator Device continues to be deployed around the parish.
- Our Highways & Transport Committee regularly meets to discuss, investigate and press for solutions to traffic related issues
- We correspond with National Highways whenever necessary to challenge issues for which they are responsible.
- With the support of our County Councillor, we continue to take every opportunity to meet with Essex Highways representatives.
- We correspond with hauliers on their use of the B1008 when a more suitable alternative exists.
- We recently funded an automated traffic count to provide data to help support our ongoing call for speed management measures through Ford End village.
- We liaise with the Community Speed Watch teams in Ford End and Great Waltham who continue to provide an invaluable traffic calming service for our communities.


We had a record breaking Scout Breakfast - 1st June - we served 138 breakfasts! More than we were

This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the AGM and May meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

We conducted the annual election of our officers and completed the various governance protocols necessary to continue our work. We currently still have one vacancy on the Council, so if you are interested in joining through the co-option process, please contact the Clerk for details.

We agreed to implement a 5-year strategic plan. This provides a framework within which long-term projects, medium-term activities and day-to-day tasks can be considered and managed in ways which give coherent and consistent focus for their successful delivery. In addition, we also agreed to implement annual plans which will describe our more tactical and operational actions and activities. Both the strategic plan and the current action plan will be posted on the parish website.

This month we decided to seek feedback from residents on two particular traffic related matters. First, we agreed to deliver an information request letter to affected residents concerning car parking issues along Cherry Garden Road, Great Waltham. And then we resolved to begin maintaining a database of road traffic collisions and road closures in the parish as reported to us by residents. Both matters are driven by a desire to improve our position when lobbying for improvements. Although we have no direct powers in relation to highways matters and the use of land owned by others, with greater input and information from parishioners we stand better chances of getting favourable hearings.

We also agreed to acquire the TruCam services provided by Maldon District Council's Community Engagement Team. TruCam is a mobile enforcement system used to target speeding drivers, and will be regularly deployed in the parish by trained MDC operatives approved by Essex Police.

The next monthly meeting will be on Monday 21st July at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend our public meetings.
