

From your County Cllr Mike Steel - Hedges

I get many complaints about hedges overhanging pavements and causing pedestrians to walk on the road. Most of these are privately owned hedges and we (ECC) do not cut them. If they overhang the pavement, our obligation is to ask the private landowner to cut them back. We do this by sending a letter. Usually, we get no response, so we send another one. Eventually, our enforcement team send an S154 order requiring the landowner to cut back their hedge. Mostly, that gets ignored, so we follow up with our own team to do the cutting and then have to take the landowner to court to recover costs. This is all a long drawn out process and spends taxpayer's money unnecessarily. So, if you live adjacent to a road or pavement, do have a look to see if your hedge overhangs the pavement and is causing an obstruction – and please cut it back! Actually, you could be liable if your overhanging hedge causes a danger! The main hedge cutting season in the UK, to avoid disturbing nesting birds, is generally considered to be September to February. Cutting hedges between March 1st and August 31st is often restricted or prohibited due to bird nesting laws. This is to protect nesting birds, their nests, and eggs. However, if you confirm that there are no nests in the hedge, you can cut anytime.

Little Waltham & Great Notley Surgery Patient Participation Group.

We're excited to share a few important updates with you. The new booking system, Anima is now up and running and is proving successful in making it easier for patients to get appointments or guidance with appropriate clinicians. The system is being closely monitored for any shortcomings or inconsistencies and adjustments are being made. As we are sure you are aware the Surgery is heavily subscribed and in need of more space, but every effort is being made to ensure that the patient experience at all levels is a positive one.

As you can see the PPG has set up a Facebook page that will be used to post news updates and basic information which we hope will help to keep patients better informed on services available etc. It will not be used for sharing any personal information nor will patients be able to add comments. Little Waltham Surgery has been redecorated throughout to make it more cheerful and welcoming and Great Notley will be following suit.

The PPG has been involved in discussions concerning the new NHS 10-year strategy, which looks promising. The NHS has three main aims:

- 1. to improve levels of healthcare in the community to allow easier patient access and to reduce the load on hospitals.
- 2. to move away from analogue to digital processes.
- 3. to focus on proactive measure to prevent illness and promote healthy lifestyles. Within this there is a recognition that changes will need to be made within housing developments to ensure that the necessary infrastructure is in place from the beginning to meet needs.

The next meeting of the PPG is on Wednesday 17th September, 7pm at Little Waltham Surgery and all are welcome.

20mph Speed Limits on Residential Roads

Safer Essex Roads Partnership (SERP) brings together various including Essex Police, Essex Fire and Rescue Service, Essex County Council and others who work to eliminate deaths and serious injuries on the roads.

They recently contacted Great Waltham Parish Council via the local Community Speedwatch Co-ordinators seeking the views of our residents regarding 20mph speed

limits where they live. Feedback is being sought from across the county in the form of a survey and one of the questions asks us if local consultation has taken place.

It must be stressed that this does not mean that anything will happen, or happen quickly. The SERP (which does not implement speed limits) is simply seeking to understand the level of community support for lower limits in residential areas/communities. This is a summary of some of the items discussed at the July meeting of the Parish Council. For more details, see the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

In his update to the meeting, Mike Steel, our city and county councillor, reported that local government reform and devolution for Essex has been discussed by both bodies. As things stand, the City Council leader has indicated a preference for a five new unitary authorities model for the county, while the County Council leader prefers three. The ultimate decision, based on the representations it receives, will be made by Central Government. While not directly affected organisationally, the Parish Council is keen to understand how local services will be affected and whether own its ability to engage with what will become, under either option, a larger (and potentially more remote) second tier authority, will be impacted.

Mike also indicated that the issuance of a DCO (Development Consent Order) is the next stage in the process National Grid is following in its proposals for a pylon transmission line through East Anglia. More locally, the current understanding is that National Grid is sticking with a proposal of lower, wider pylons, but unfortunately still at the locations they originally indicated for the higher versions, which seems to negate any benefit of less intrusiveness by virtue of size by their being positioned close to properties and the main road in/out of the village.

We discussed a request received from the Safer Essex Roads Partnerships (SERP) asking us to complete a survey designed to gauge the views on 20mph speed limits in residential areas. We felt we needed local input to provide a fully informed response, so our Highways & Transport Committee was delegated the task of organising our own online survey to understand the views of parishioners, and to then respond to the SERP survey accordingly.

The meeting also discussed and agreed resolutions in relation to the future maintenance and upkeep of VG150, the village green owned by the Council at the eastern end of Church Lane, Ford End where it joins the B1008. More widely, we also agreed to review byelaws across all the parish's green spaces, a task identified as part of the activities documented in our Strategic Plan.

The next monthly meeting will be on Monday 15th September at The Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend our public meetings.




