




Great Waltham C of E Primary School

FORD END GARDEN CLUB

It is situated on the Essex/Suffolk borders and is part of Mill Farm comprising 86 acres with a brook running through the valley and draining into the river Stour. This was Bob and Ann's retirement project and the farmhouse needed restoration along with farm buildings and the mill house itself which had a metal waterwheel specially installed. After many ups and downs farming the land it was decided to plant a wood and create a private nature reserve. This woodland has been successful in its aim of attracting dormice and will now be taken over by the Suffolk Wildlife Trust. Longhorn cattle are now grazed on grassland; the vegetable plot is now divided into allotments and the small mill house looking over a wildlife pond is a holiday let. The evening was a wonderful insight into what an idyllic place that Assington Mill and farm have become.



Chelmsford Local Plan Review

Central Govt has demanded that Chelmsford review its Local Plan to show a build rate of 1400 dwellings per year (around 60% higher than the current plan). This is a target set by Govt in order to meet their ambition of an extra 1.5 million homes. Unfortunately, there have also been shortfalls in the current plan - delays in Beaulieu expansion (because Govt withdrew infrastructure funding), and slow down of delivering the large strategic sites (for various reasons). The net result is that City Council is having to look at new sites that can be readily delivered within the next 5 years. This affects Ford End, where City Council is proposing increasing the site south of the school from 20 to 75 dwellings. This increase was not initiated by the developers! The public can register their views at the City Council Local Plan website, until 8th January 2026. In conjunction with the Parish Council, I am seeking infrastructure improvements in Ford End that could include the Average Speed Camera (that we have been pushing for, for years), additional classroom

This is a summary of some of the items discussed at a busy October meeting of the Parish Council. For full details, please check out the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

An update from Mike Steel, our city and county councillor, included confirmation of the commencement of Highways' road gritting season; the need to register with the Planning Inspectorate to comment further on National Grid's pylons proposals; the scheduled opening of a new health centre at Beaulieu; and how the City Council's revised Local Plan was to be made public on 29th October. The meeting also discussed and made decisions on these topics:

- We adopted a new IT policy and revised the terms of reference for our committees, and agreed the need for further work to consider any recommended revisions to the byelaws which apply to Council owned or administered land.
- We noted the results of commissioning TruCam speed checks on the B1008 at Ford End. To date, over 60 enforcement actions (that is, prosecutions for speeding) had been taken. We also agreed to commission a further automatic traffic count survey in Ford End to provide data to compare with the survey conducted this time last year.
- We noted two recent generous donations to the Great Waltham Recreation Ground play area project. However, because grant bids from elsewhere have not been as fruitful as we hoped, it was agreed to make this a phased project meaning a full implementation of new equipment will take longer.
- We agree to replace the wooden posts and chains around the war memorial at Banbury Square.
- We will support a local initiative at Broad's Green to install a Christmas tree with lights on the green.
- We agreed to move the Council to a gov.uk email domain and website for its staff and councillors.
- An application to install a commemorative bench seat on the green at Broad's Green was noted. We agreed to consult all local residents before deciding whether or not to grant the request. The Council's next monthly meetings will be on Monday 15th December 2025 and Monday 19th January 2026, both at the Pavilion, Great Waltham Recreation Ground, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend our public meetings. Steve Gilbert Chair

Devolution and Local Government Reorganisation (LGR)

In May 2026, there will be elections across the whole of Essex to elect a Mayor who will sit over all the Unitary Councils created by LGR. Such a Mayor will have real power (like the Mayor of London) as opposed to our current City Council Mayor who is more of a figurehead. Following that, the existing County Council (ECC), 2 Unitaries (Thurrock and Southend) and 12 district local authorities in Essex (including Chelmsford City Council), will be abolished in March 2028 and replaced with several single tier authorities. Proposals have been submitted to the Govt to divide Essex into 3, 4 or 5 unitary councils. The Govt has now started consultation on these until 11th January. Elections for the Unitary Councils will take place in May 2027 and the elected Cllrs will spend the first year overlapping the current councils, whilst they set up the new Unitary councils ready to take over in March 2028.
