

The Great Waltham Playground Makeover – Exciting Update!

We're excited to share that Project Playground is now moving from planning into action, with stage one officially underway. Orders for the new Toddler Area have been placed and, subject to the weather, we're hopeful this will be installed by the end of March. This progress has only been possible thanks to the fantastic support we've received so far. We've successfully used £17,000 in grant funding, alongside over £3,000 raised through public donations and sponsorship from local companies. Stage one represents a major milestone for the project, this phase totalling around £62,000.

With the Toddler Area taking shape, our focus now turns to stage two – the Junior Area. This next phase will require significant fundraising, with a target of around £100,000 to create an exciting and inclusive space for older children.

It's been wonderful to see the community enthusiasm for the project so far, and we're incredibly grateful to everyone who has been involved.



This is a summary of some items discussed at the November and December 2025 meetings of the Parish Council. For full details, please check out the full and approved minutes of all Council meetings on the parish website (e-voice.org.uk/greatwalthamparish).

We agreed responses to two important consultations. First, that on local government reorganisation in Essex, where of those being consulted on we agreed to support the five new unitary-authorities model. And second, Chelmsford City Council's request for input on its proposals for additional housing sites to help meet new targets. Here we restricted our comments to the only site in the parish, land south of Ford End School, and stated a preference for fewer than the 75 new dwellings being proposed, but still including as part of the development traffic management upgrades (principally an average speed camera system on the B1008 through the village), and improvement works for Ford End recreation ground, village hall, and school.

The first phase of the Great Waltham Recreation Ground play area upgrade (for the refurbishment of the toddlers' area) was approved at a cost of £62,220, excluding VAT. The project work to fundraise for the remainder of the proposed new equipment will continue in 2026/27 and beyond.

We agreed to chair the committee of local residents to help facilitate the erection of the Christmas tree at Broad's Green. We also agreed to renew the public car parking agreement with Great Waltham Village Hall for another year. We approved costs to replace the wooden posts and renovate the chains around the war memorial at Banbury Square, and also those to replace the roof of the adjacent bus stop shelter with slates rather than the current cedar shingles, this being seen as a sensible long-term approach approved by the City Council heritage officer.

We noted the decision to wind-up Great Waltham Horticultural Society, and agreed to work with it to determine the future of the trading hut located on the Brook Mead allotment site.

We agreed the Council's new budget and precept demand. Subject to higher authority ratification, the parish council element of Great Waltham residents' 2026/27 Council Tax bill will increase by 4.9%, following the 1.9% decrease for 2025/26.

The Council's next monthly meeting will be on Tuesday 17th February 2026 at Ford End Village Hall, starting at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend our public meetings. Steve Gilbert Chair
