

#### **PARISH LETTER**

#### We are an Easter people

This year Easter Day came early - 31st of March - and was also the day when we put our clocks forward 1 hour and British Summer time began. So on the day we are all called to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus from death we've also lost an hour's sleep. Maybe there is something of a lesson to learn in this?

We do not celebrate Easter and the joys of resurrection in a vacuum. Good Friday with the death of Jesus on the cross and its associated sadness as well as possibilities is one half of God's story of redemption and hope, the other side is victory over sin and death in Christ's victorious resurrection promising new life and hope.

We celebrate the joys of Easter not apart from struggles and darkness but in the midst of them. This year at Easter: Ukraine is still invaded by a hostile foreign army and its evil leader; Israel is still suffering the loss of many families, people in Gaza and Palestine are suffering from invasion, death and indiscriminate destruction; other areas of our world suffer from armed conflict, famine, and injustice.

In the beginning of John's gospel he writes, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1: 5) It almost seems that light needs darkness to truly reveal its glory, but darkness will never overcome the light of Christ - and in that lies our true hope.

The quote "We are an Easter people" was used by Pope John Paul II, but its origins are unclear and go much further back in Christian history - possibly to St. Augustine. However, the full quote is "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song!"

Alleluia simply means 'Praise the Lord'. There are many reasons to praise our Lord; for the hope Easter brings, for the salvation that comes from God, that we have survived all that is happening in our lives, that God's grace still shines in our world, that Jesus has made our faith possible, that even in our broken world the light of Christ still shines clear.

Take your pick as to what suits you and your life this Easter. Let us live in the light, hope, promise, life and grace that Easter offers. May our lives be beacons in the darkness, our faith be infectious and life-giving, our witness be full of the grace and love of God.

This Eater, and always, let us live as Easter people and praise the Lord for all His benefits.

#### St James the Least of All

#### On why a church should always resist change

The Rectory

St James the Least

My dear Nephew Darren

I am not the least surprised you have got yourself into trouble; innovation is never to be encouraged. New ideas tend to cause revolutions. The move from incandescent light bulbs to energy saving ones may ultimately change the Church of England.

Change is something everyone claims to be in favour of – provided it has no measurable effect on their own lives. I remember as a young curate once suggesting that at the Harvest Supper, tables might be enlarged so that eight people could sit together rather than the traditional six, thus helping more people get to know one another. The response would have been similar if I had suggested we travel to London to murder the Prime Minister. I was firmly told that tables for six had been perfectly adequate for parishioners in Queen Victoria's day. For the rest of my curacy, I was regarded as a revolutionary, to be watched carefully.

So, at your last visit to our church, to suggest that our 11am Matins might be moved to 10.30am, in order to encourage those who wanted to have more of the day free to themselves, certainly lobbed a hand grenade among the post-Service coffee cups. The only person who was mildly in favour was Colonel Wainwright, who quickly realised that it would give him an extra half-hour at the gin and tonics before lunch.

Should you ever feel that people lack imagination, you should watch them in action when they find reasons for resisting an unwelcome suggestion. One said that the time couldn't be moved, since it would then be too early for the local bus – omitting to mention that none of our congregation travel to church by bus and that the service doesn't run on Sundays anyway. Another pointed out that it would confuse those who didn't attend church – not explaining why if they never attended, it mattered what time the Service was. A third, rather touchingly mentioned that it wouldn't give the rector time to enjoy his breakfast after the rigours of the 8am Service.

Your suggestion did, however, serve one useful purpose; it brought our congregation together in united opposition. They may not necessarily always know what they are for, but they certainly know what they are against. For that, I thank you.

#### A Ramble round Rome (continued)

The 3<sup>rd</sup> major poet of the Augustan era, following Virgil and Horace, was Publius Ovidus, known to us as Ovid. His leading work was the Metamorphoses ("Changes"), completed by 8 AD, an extensive mythological poem about people turned into fanciful beings. He also wrote some love poetry, the Ars Amorata. In 8 AD he was banished by the emperor Augustus to the remotest part of the empire at the time, to a place on the eastern Black Sea coast. The reason for this is obscure but may be because his love poetry promoted free and easy relationships, contrary to the Emperor's adherence to monogamous marriage which was his strict policy certainly for his own family, though rarely in practice obeyed. Ovid continued to write poetry in exile but longed to return home. The self-pitying, "Ovidio exule, Musae planguntur." (Ovid in exile, the Muses weep).

Another quote: "Tempora labuntur, tacitisque senescimus annis." (Times run on, but we grow silently old in years)

Pretty unusual again!

Liz also talked about the history & cultures of Kuching and then her two return visits there, once when she was 21, to stay with her Chinese godmother and seeing the poverty and lifestyle of those living there. Then last October she took Peter, her husband. What an experience that must have been! All the changes in the country over the last years, particularly seeing the site of where her home used to be, meeting up with some of her school friends and finding a book about her school, St. Mary's and discovering a photograph of her parents wedding in it! Amazing!

What a great experience. Thank you, Liz (and Peter), for sharing your story with us.


#### **WORSHIP**

Bishop Jill explained that Zacchaeus loved money. To make him feel even more popular, he took even more money so the Romans were impressed by him. Money made him happy. Money was like his God. Money is not a proper God. When Jesus came to town, Zacchaeus wanted to listen to Him. Zacchaeus had a shock because Jesus asked him to come down from the tree and have tea.

We asked the children: What do you put your trust in? Being popular? Having lots of friends? Sport? Money?

We asked the children, how Jesus changed Zacchaeus' life? We then explained that, Zacchaeus realised he could be popular without taking money from others. Christians believe that Jesus wants so much more for them than that. Zacchaeus realised that he could be popular because Jesus had a place in his heart. Christians believe that Jesus longs to find a place in their heart too and anyone can invite Him into their heart at any time.

The following week, during Worship, Bishop Jill explained to the children (via video) that when Jeremiah was taken into exile in Babylon, he was under pressure. He heard some very fiery words from God. Sometimes Christians feel closest to God when they are under immense pressure. Bishop Jill explained to us that Jeremiah felt the word of God so strongly in his heart that it felt like a hammer, addressing all the bad events that were taking place at that time.






