PARISH LETTER

Now and not yet

I have a friend who, when starting a new novel, always reads the last page first. If she likes the ending she'll then read the whole book! I must admit that I've never understood that, I like the suspense of a plot being revealed, but then she is also a Methodist.

However, for 21st century Christians it is how this time of year can feel. We are in this supposedly solemn and spiritually growing time of year thinking of the events leading up to the crucifixion and resurrection – yet we know the ending. Of course, it is the best ending we could imagine so I suppose it is worth the journey.

It is hard to approach Good Friday and Easter Day without knowing not only the ending but all the theological thought and teaching that we have heard over the course of our lives of faith. We don't just know the ending, but we know why it is important, and what it all means for our lives and the world.

Maybe it might be useful this Lent to approach our readings and the gospel account of the last weeks of Jesus life before the resurrection and try and suspend our knowledge and understanding. How would it be to hear the words of Jesus, see His actions, watch how the disciples and others respond without the knowledge of the end?

Maybe it would make this time more fulfilling if we could approach the things we've always known with fresh eyes and minds and see things from the disciples' viewpoint, not knowing what would happen, when and why? Like a good novel the suspense would be exciting, the twists and turns shocking and the ending be a surprise.

Although we know that the resurrection is a real event that has such an impact on our faith, church life & worship and how we see the world, there is still a 'not yet' element to it. We can hear about Jesus' resurrection, believe in it and allow that to shape our faith and worship – but as yet we've not experienced resurrection. Our Bible and faith tell us we will somehow join in that resurrection in the future but for now it remains a future hope.

Jesus told His followers that they needed to become like children to enter fully into His kingdom. Part of that is surely to see the world, and our faith, with a sense of wonder and awe. This April, as we are thankful that we know the great ending, let's journey together with that sense of wonder and awe, hear the words of Jesus and see His actions, with fresh eyes and be amazed at what new perspectives the Holy Spirit may reveal to us.

18th April – GOOD FRIDAY, Jesus and the thieves on the Cross

Luke's account of the crucifixion (Luke 23:32-43) emphasises the mocking of the crowd, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself' (35,37,39). In their view a Messiah does not hang on a cross and suffer. In considering the two men who were crucified with Jesus, we are also confronted with the issue of how Jesus secures salvation for us.

The words of one of those crucified with Jesus reflected the crowd's taunts: 'Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us.' He highlights the question of Jesus' identity: how can He save others, when He cannot save Himself from death? He failed to see that the cross itself was the means of salvation.

So – what kind of Messiah was Jesus?

The other criminal's response in his last moments is a moving expression of faith. When challenging the other man, he spoke of the utter injustice of the crucifixion: 'this man has done nothing wrong.' He perceived the truth that Jesus was indeed the Messiah. In a wonderful picture of grace, 'remember me when You come into Your kingdom', the second thief confessed his guilt and secured Jesus' forgiveness and mercy.

In reply, Jesus promised the man life from the moment of death; 'Today you will be with Me in paradise.' Jesus used the picture of a walled garden to help the man understand His promise of protection and security in God's love and acceptance eternally.

Each one of us has to choose how we react to Jesus on the cross. Do we want Him to 'remember' us when He comes into His kingdom, or not? If you were to die tonight, how confident would you be of going to be with Jesus? 'For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God" (1 Peter 3:18).

Jennifer Aldridge has lived in the Preston area since she was 4. Trained as a





WORSHIP

We celebrated Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday.


