PARISH LETTER

Here comes the sun?

As I write this in mid July we are still waiting for a proper summer to turn up. Outside my study window it's grey and dull and looks like it might rain again. I know we've had a few bright, warm, sunny days but they seem to be increasingly rare at the moment. People are asking where has our summer gone and suggesting that we're not doing (praying?) enough about it. I do hope that by the time you get to read this summer will be here in full force and we'll be able to enjoy days out, relaxing in our gardens and having BBQs - of course by then it will be too hot!

One thing that some friends are keen to remind us, while bemoaning the grey wet weather, is that the sun is always shining - above the clouds. Those of us who have been fortunate enough to fly abroad certainly know this. As soon as the plane breaks through the clouds there is unending sunshine and beautiful blue skies. I wonder if that is why in many sci-fi films people live on cities in the sky, far above the impact of the weather.

I do also wonder if that would get boring very quickly? There is something about the rhythms of our seasons and weather that help us weather life and its ups and downs. A life of perpetual sunshine and warmth is somehow unnatural and doesn't really happen anywhere in our world.

Like life our spiritual moods fluctuate often depending on our circumstances, different situations and just how we're feeling. It can be easy to let all that's going on around us to affect our relationship with each other and our Lord. When we have had a bright and sunny day (especially for things that are important to us) people have talked about our Lord sending sun on the righteous. Unfortunately for us the full quote from Jesus in Matthew chapter 5 is 'for He makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous.' We don't have any claim on sunny days because of our faith but we can pray for them.

Likewise we can seek our Lord in the times where life is difficult. The Bible is full of assurances that He in near and responds to our prayers. Just like the sun always shining above the clouds so with our Lord. He is always good, generous and close by - we just need to life our eyes, our expectations, our prayers above the clouds and circumstances of our lives to meet with Him.

I do hope we get some really good sunny and warm summer days in the weeks ahead. It is good for us all to enjoy. It is also good for us to enjoy the Lord's blessings and presence, especially when life is hard. A Ramble round Rome (continued)

The last article before the summer break I devote to the emperor Marcus Aurelius. He was the last emperor of the classic period of empire, dying in 180AD, but also famous for his "Meditations", an exposition of stoic philosophy. The 18th century author Edward Gibbon began his Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire, with reign of Commodus, the son of Marcus Aurelius, Commodus being the emperor who features in the film "Gladiator" starring Russell Crowe. So it was mostly all downhill for the empire from there, albeit it survived in the west for more than another 200 years.

Marcus' Meditations are available for all on the net, full of sound principle and wise saws. It must however be said that Marcus was a persistent and ferocious opponent of the early church, despite his calm stoic philosophy. What I perhaps rather unfairly to the

great man, want to focus on is an anecdote of his early life which unfortunately I cannot track down but am certain I have read. Also it presumably comes from Marcus himself as it is an intimate detail from his life before becoming emperor. His predecessors Hadrian, and then Antoninus Pius, had selected the young Marcus as a future emperor, rather in the manner of the Buddhist religion of selection of a Dalai Llama. One day the future emperor was out riding with an escort, both no doubt richly dressed, and mounted on sleek well groomed horses, the E type Jaguars of the day. They encountered a shepherd driving his flock along a road. The shepherd, a working man with little time for a pair of young toffs, passed some remark in their direction. Marcus, in response to the remark, did not turn the other cheek, but rode his horse hard at the flock, dispersing it in all directions, fully aware of the consequences. Which were for the poor shepherd that it would take him hours to regather the flock, even if he could do so, with the loss of even one sheep being a substantial loss to a working man of limited means. So it was a very nasty thing for Marcus to do. Perhaps in later life he had a conscience about it. But it is the earliest example I know of, of a road rage incident.



Stella was born in a Lancashire village, pre-war, and learnt from an early age to have a positive attitude and strong faith. Her mother's quote was 'there's always something you can do in the face of adversity'. 9th August – Mary Sumner, founder of the Mothers' Union

The Mothers' Union is now more than 140 years old. It has accomplished a staggering amount in that time, and nowadays numbers more than four million members, doing good work in 83 countries. That is a far cry from the modest circle of prayer for mothers who cared about family life, which is how it all began with a rector's wife, Mary Sumner. Mary was born in late 1828 in Swinton, near Manchester. When she was four, her family moved to Herefordshire. Mary's father, Thomas Heywood, was a banker and historian. Her mother has been described as a woman of "faith, charm and sympathy" – qualities which Mary certainly inherited. Mrs Heywood also held informal 'mothers' meetings' at her home, to encourage local women. Those meetings may well have inspired Mary's later work.

Mary was educated at home, spoke three foreign languages, and sang well. While in her late teens, on a visit to Rome she met George Sumner, a son of the Bishop of Winchester. It was a well-connected family: George's uncle became Archbishop of Canterbury, and his second cousin was William Wilberforce. Mary and George married in July 1848, soon after his ordination. They moved to Old Alresford in 1851 and had three children: Margaret, Louise and George. Mary dedicated herself to raising her children and supporting her husband's ministry by providing music and Bible classes.

When in 1876 Mary's eldest daughter Margaret, gave birth, Mary was reminded how difficult she had found the burden of motherhood. Soon she decided to hold a meeting to which she invited the local women not only of her own class, but also all the village mothers. Her aim was to find out if women could be brought together to offer each other prayer and mutual support in their roles as wives and mothers. That meeting at Old Alresford Rectory was the inaugural meeting of the Mothers' Union.

For 11 years, the Mothers' Union was limited to Old Alresford. Then in 1885 the Bishop of Newcastle invited Mary to address the women churchgoers of the Portsmouth Church Congress, some 20 miles away. Mary gave a passionate speech about the poor state of national morality, and the vital need for women to use their vocation as mothers to change the nation for the better. A number of the women present went back to their parishes to found mothers' meetings on Sumner's pattern. Soon, the Mothers' Union spread to the dioceses of Ely, Exeter, Hereford, Lichfield and Newcastle. By 1892, there were already 60,000 members in 28 dioceses, and by 1900 there were 169,000 members. By the time Mary died in 1921, she had seen MU cross the seas and become an international organisation of prayer and good purpose.







