PARISH LETTER

A time for receiving and giving.

By now I suspect you're all fed up with seeing Christmas (or more likely Xmas) being advertised. It seems like the start of the season gets earlier each year. It has been rather odd seeing Christmas and Halloween merchandise side by side in the shops for several weeks.

What are you hoping for this Christmas? I'm sure there are a few things that we'd like to receive from our loved ones as a sign of that love and that they know us really well. It doesn't seem to matter the size or value of the gift (except for children) but some token that we're valued, loved and remembered. Of course if we were vying for Miss World then the answer would be world peace - and that seems unlikely for this or any future Christmas at the moment.

We'd all love to see those close to us and spend time together - as long as it doesn't turn into a time of stress, busyness and bad tempers.

One of the reasons for our amazing Christmas story is that God wanted to be closer to his created family - us. He wanted a way to forgive us for our sin, stubbornness and waywardness that was just. That culminated in the sending of the best gift ever - His own Son born as Jesus in strange circumstances, in an obscure village, at a seemingly insignificant time.

God's greatest gift to us asks us for a response, not like the swapping of material presents which we'll do on or around the 25th of December. His gift is given out of love for a need we didn't know we had, by a loving Father who only gives the best gifts. So what is our response? The words of one of my least favourite carols (do ask me about it) says;

What can I give Him poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would give a lamb

If I were a wise man, I would do my part

Yet what I can, I give Him, give my heart.

Those words of Christina Rosetti remind us that there is nothing of material value that we can actually respond with to God's generosity - it is all His anyway. The one thing He wants is what He can't control - our very selves.

We know the importance of being with family and friends at any time of the year is special and important- especially if we've been separated in some way. Being present and offering ourselves, our time, our love is what is important, not the gifts and food.

It is the same for our Lord. Being present with Him, showing our love for Him, is always more important than all we can do for Him. This Christmas let's receive God's wonderful gift, Jesus, and respond with love.

6th December - What's in a (Christmas) Name

What do your family call him, that cheerful old man in a red robe and floppy hat who pops up everywhere at Christmas? Sometimes he's Father Christmas, sometimes Santa Claus, and in parts of Europe he's Saint Nicholas. That's his real name, abbreviated to 'Santa Claus' by Brits and Americans who don't like to follow the Europeans, and then turned into a more homely, cuddly kind of name for the children. Whatever he's called, his function is the same – delivering presents to children at Christmas.

The first St Nicholas was bishop of Myra, in the country we now call Turkey, in the fourth century. He was known as the friend of the poor, and especially poor or abused children. At (or just before) Christmas he went around handing out presents to them, as well as rescuing some from dreadful circumstances. The red robe our modern Santa Claus wears may be a vague representation of a bishop's garment, and the floppy hat is his mitre!

The original good bishop from 1600 years ago is remembered by the Church on December 6th, and the lucky children in Belgium and the Netherlands get their presents then.

Christmas Geese

The story is told of a farmer who didn't believe in Jesus. One snowy Christmas Eve, his wife was taking their children to a service at their local church. He refused to come saying: 'Why would God lower Himself to come to Earth as a man? That's ridiculous!' So, they left him at home.

During the evening the winds grew stronger, and the snow turned to a blizzard. He heard a series of loud thumps on the window. In the field near his house he saw a flock of wild geese. They had been migrating south when they got caught in the snowstorm. They were lost and stranded on his farm, with no food or shelter.

The man wanted to help the geese and so he opened the doors of the barn, hoping they would go inside for shelter. But the geese didn't do anything, despite the man's efforts to move them. He made a breadcrumb trail leading to the barn and tried to shoo them toward the barn, but they only got more scared and scattered.

Nothing he did could get them to go into the barn: 'Why don't they follow me?!' Then he realised: 'If only I were a goose and become one of them, then I could save them.' Finally, he understood the heart of the Christmas message. God has become one of us in Jesus. The eternal creator God has entered time and space as a baby, to show us who God is and how we can know Him.

This Christmas, let's celebrate again this amazing truth that we have a God who knows and can meet our needs in Jesus. 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel, which means 'God with us'.' Matthew 1:23.

the fifth year, then all hymns subsequently will be played at double speed and with one verse missing. Should one person have been invited to read for two successive years, then their annual appearance thereafter will be taken as an inalienable right for the rest of their lifetime – and probably longer than that. To drop them may well invoke legal proceedings,

Then there is the batting order to be considered. Someone from the church council will take it as a deliberate slight if they are placed lower in the order than a representative of the Men's Fellowship and no self-respecting bell ringer would voluntarily follow a brass cleaner.

If you do not specify where they should read from and how the readings should end, then a form of ecclesiastical inflation will happen. If the first reader speaks from the chancel step, the next one will go to the lectern; after the sanctuary and pulpit have been utilised, the final reader will probably ask you to move so he can take your place. The variations on "Here endeth", "This is the Word of the Lord", and "Thanks be to God", are endless and will increase in length as the Service progresses. The final reader will probably end with a lengthy exegesis on what he thinks the passage means, correcting whatever you said in your sermon.

I once made the mistake of not telling all readers which Bible translation to use. One, an Old Testament expert, therefore decided to read in Hebrew. Not to be outdone, another read her Gospel passage in Greek – apologising beforehand that it may not be a perfect rendering, as she was spontaneously translating it from the English. And some say Christians are not competitive.

You have two alternatives: either repeat last year's Service without any alteration, saying that it could not be improved, or design your own – and then take Christmas off






