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PARISH LETTER

Building up our church – Presence and Proclamation

We continue some of the learning journey the PCC is going on as part of the Renewal Programme. We now turn our attention to two more P's – of the 5 P's; Presence and Proclamation.

Presence is something quite obvious – how do people in our community know we are here and what we do as a church? In many ways we are very obviously present in Grimsargh; our building stands out at one end of the village, we have notice boards outside church and school, we have a website and use Facebook, we have distributed our leaflets to every home in the parish and many people receive our magazine. We also have events which many people attend; the coffee morning at the club, Garden Party and Christmas Fair, special services throughout the year, our FAF events and our various links with our church school. We are hugely present for a small village church family.

We do, however, need to spend time thinking how we can make the most of our presence – how do people know who we are, what we believe, and how to explore joining us? The PCC had some ideas which we will continue to explore – branded t-shirts (you may have noticed those at the Garden Party), posters based on our leaflet at events, TikTok and Instagram presence for the younger generations (I will admit I know nothing about these!), sharing our personal experience of faith and the church in conversations, maybe being available in the graveyard on special days.

Maybe you have some ideas how we can make the most of our big presence for a small church. Please let myself or a member of the PCC know. We do well – how can we do better?

However, just being present in our community doesn't mean people will explore our church, worship or faith. We need to **Proclaim** who we are, what we believe, how to make connection with us, and most importantly invite people to join. The phrase 'I'm going, it's going to be really good, will you come with me?' is going to be heard a lot over the coming months.

As well as our social and fundraising events we need to ensure we have specific events to invite people to where alongside a good time they will specifically hear the good news of Jesus and God's love for them. The PCC have had several thoughts; a Mission Weekend at Harvest, specific Invitational cards to special services and events, Back to Church Sundays (Welcome Home), walking fellowship, BBQ, church picnic, guest services. What kind of events would you invite friends and family to – knowing there will be a short talk about faith? Do let us know.

We can, and need to be, more proactive in letting people know not just that we're here, but what we are here for and what we believe. That is the role of all of us. Jesus sends us with a message of hope and love to the world – and in particular to the village of Grimsargh. The early church did it in the Acts of the Apostles, the church around the world has been doing it for centuries. Now is the time to take up the baton – let's proclaim Jesus loud and clear.

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MISSION WEEKEND.

On how to baffle the church committee

My dear Nephew Darren

I was delighted to hear that you have been made chairman of the Missionary Sub-committee; it should help you to hone your skills in appearing to encourage committee members to contribute while ensuring that they only say the things you want to hear. It is a skill that needs not a little practice; democracy only works if all the important decisions have been made beforehand.

However, do remember that sub-committees are only formed in order either to kill an idea stone dead, or to give the chairman of the main committee some time to decide what he wants, since he isn't sure how to handle the issue at that moment. I formed a sub-committee in 1999 to discuss Miss Fothergill's suggestion of creating a 'water feature' on the Rector's Glebe land, as a way of celebrating the Millennium. More than 25 years later, we are still actively discussing the idea.

I noted at the time that no one wanted the thing on their *own* land. It's significant that whenever people suggest some imposing edifice, they always think it will be most appropriate either in the Rector's Garden, or in some public place, well out of sight of their own homes.

While the Water Feature Group has been working away tirelessly, and endless masons and architects have been approached, a suitable design has yet to be presented. It looks as if a suggestion will eventually be considered by my hundredth successor as we enter the third

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Millennium. That is the customary rate of progress for St James the Least, which I find entirely satisfactory.

The procedure for decision-making is always the same: after enormous effort, the sub-committee will produce a carefully worded report, which will be circulated round all members of the church council. At the next meeting, they will be thanked profusely for all their hard work, and the matter will be discussed at great length. It will then be proposed that the final decision will be taken at the next meeting, after everyone has had time to consider the matter more thoroughly.

Come the next meeting, the item will somehow fail to appear on the agenda, and when it is raised in Any Other Business, it will be pointed out that it is now far too late in the evening to tackle such an important issue. From then on, you can be assured, it will sink without trace.

Always remember the golden rule: a church committee meeting consists of a body of people waiting to go home.

We were delighted to welcome Geraldine McFarlane to Mother's Union when she was enrolled during the service on July 19th.

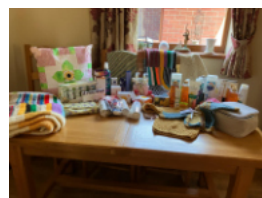
I hope you all have a happy and restful summer break. Keep safe and we will be together again for our service in church in September 16th.

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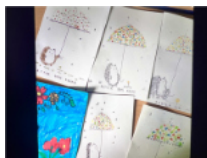
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Courageous Advocacy

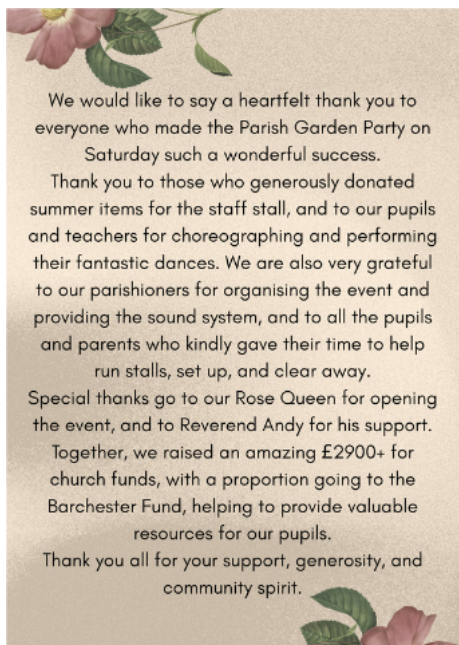

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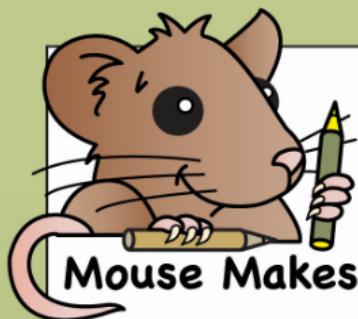
