

## **PARISH LETTER**

#### Lent - a new start?

By the time you read this we will be part way through the Church's season of Lent. It did seem a strange combination when Ash Wednesday, Valentine's Day and my birthday fell on the same day.

How are we to approach Lent this year? It is traditionally a time of more solemn worship, no Gloria at Communion, and no flowers in church buildings. All of which strikes me as a bit odd when Sunday is always a day when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and flowers are beginning to pop their heads up in gardens and parks.

Maybe we need to approach Lent differently and use our personal Bible reading and prayer during the week to open ourselves up to God so that we can be prepared to worship each week and see the things He would have us change in our lives.

Of course that all sounds a bit scary and challenging but in the early Church it was the time of preparation and instruction for potential new Christians to get ready for their baptism - often on Easter Day. One of the key parts of this preparation and learning was having other, more mature, Christians to walk alongside the new converts. Their baptism marked a new start in life as they turned from their sins and evil, died to their old way of life by being dunked under the water, and then being raised to a new life of faith and hope as they were raise up out of the water, trusting in Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

So what about us? Maybe we can mark Easter as a time of renewed faith and life. Maybe you can join with me in reading the Diocesan lent booklet. Maybe as we listen to the readings and comments we will hear the challenge of the Holy Spirit to change and be renewed.


Of course we don't do all this on our own. We have our brothers and sisters in Christ to support us on our journey. Why not have a chat with someone about what you've learned (you don't have to go into all the personal challenges if you don't want to). I'm always happy to talk to you about what's happening in your life of faith and encourage you.

Worry less about not eating chocolate and cakes etc. - unless that's a challenge you hear from our Lord. Concentrate on deepening your faith and knowing Jesus more.

On Easter Day as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus and give thanks for the new life He gives there will be a possibility to affirm our baptism promises and mark that using water from our font. Let's explore our faith and life and put off what holds us back as we rejoice in the new start, and new life, that God offers.

Let's listen to Him, hear and respond to His call, and rejoice in His new life.

## Mothering Sunday and Mother Church. 10th March

The Fourth Sunday in Lent was called 'Mid-Lent' or 'Refreshment Sunday', when the rigours of Lent were relaxed more than was normal for a feast day. It is called Mothering Sunday as a reference to the Epistle reading for the Day (Galatians 4:21-31). The Lenten Epistles follow from each other with teaching about our life as Christians and how we are to follow Christ.

On Mid-Lent Sunday the Epistle talks of bondage and freedom; the bondage of the Law and the Old Covenant as compared to the freedom in Christ, "the promised one", and the New Covenant. Verse 26 reads "But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all." We gain our freedom from Christ and, as it was seen before the Reformation, the Church.

Thus, Mothering Sunday is about the freedom that we gain through the promise of Jesus Christ delivered through our Mother the Church. People were encouraged to go to their 'Mother Church' (their home church or their home Cathedral) to worship and give thanks. Hence apprentices, and others, went home for the weekend and often brought gifts (or accumulated pay) home to their family.

On the other hand, Mother's Day is a secular festival invented in 1904 and is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday in May in most countries in the world. The UK seems to be the exception. In recent years Mothering Sunday has been hijacked to take the place of a special, secular day to give thanks for our mothers.

## A Ramble round Rome (continued)

The poet Horatius Flaccus, more commonly known as Horace, lived in the later period of the Roman Republic and was initially a supporter of the anti Caesar faction. Following their defeat he took advantage of the amnesty offered by Augustus and aligned himself with the new imperial regime. Maecenas, the prominent Augustan politician whom I mentioned last month, sponsored Horace not only by moral support but also by giving him a farm in the country, so that his poetic work has been somewhat tainted by his being regarded as a lackey for the empire. He stepped round this by putting himself in a modest light as a lowly ordinary Joe with only a passing interest in the great political issues of the day, affecting to be more interested in his local affairs than who was "putting fear into Tigranes", an obscure king who was a client of Rome on its eastern frontier.

His most famous quote is "Carpe diem", seize the day, still often quoted today; the rest of the quote is "quam minimum credula postero," trusting as little as possible in tomorrow. The parallel quote in English literature to express the same sentiment is the 17th century poet Robert Herrick's, "Gather ye rose buds while ye may..." Horace was also something of a snob; "Odi profanum vulgus, et arceo", I despise the common people, and keep them at bay. He preferred a quiet life outside Rome and away from the crowds, and is none the worse for that.

## St James the Least of All

## On why pews SHOULD be uncomfortable

My dear Nephew Darren

Visits from your parishioners to our church are always welcome. But I did not expect them to return to you complaining because our pews are uncomfortable.

Pews are *meant* to be uncomfortable. The unshakeable belief of our congregation is that the more uncomfortable the pew, the holier the worship must be. By the same token, an 8am Service is more fervent than one at 11am, since it is much

more socially inconvenient. If you add on enduring sub-zero temperatures and damp, then sainthood clearly beckons. Your people may be used to lolling in upholstered chairs in tropical temperatures, but I am sure such comfort places their souls in grave peril.

Our pews were built 500 years ago, when people were several inches shorter and many pounds lighter, and so could accommodate themselves on them perfectly adequately. The fact that a twenty-first century body is in constant danger of sliding off the seat and requires knees to be folded somewhere near ears at least helps to keep minds focused – apart from Colonel Wainwright, who still manages to sleep peacefully throughout Matins every Sunday.

I could point out that your chairs make kneeling almost impossible – although I suspect that posture is not encouraged in your church, as people would then be unable to read the words on your overhead projector or wave their arms about quite as easily during the hymns. While the majority of our congregation find the Anglican crouch perfectly adequate, you can see those who flop to their knees on hearing "let us pray" from the clouds of dust sent up from suddenly compressed hassocks, which were purchased to commemorate Queen Victoria's Accession.

I may also point out that our box pews are very useful for modern times. Once a family is seated, with the door firmly shut, then any toddler is penned in and unable to use the aisles as a racing circuit. Medieval carpenters were clearly forward-thinking people. Admittedly, box pew doors do tend to stick, and few manage to look dignified while they wait for step ladders to be brought before they can climb out.


If only you would remove your chairs and substitute benches without backs, turn off all heating and replace carpets with slate slabs, I am sure your congregation's religious zeal would soar.

#### SCHOOL REPORT

#### WORSHIP

This week, year 2 prepared and delivered our whole school worship, focusing on Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday is otherwise known as 'Pancake Day' and Christians traditionally use this day to eat up the starchy foods in their cupboards so they can be reminded of the time Jesus spent in the desert for 40 days and 40 nights without food or water. A time which Christians now call Lent.






