#### **PARISH LETTER**

#### Growth and Renewal

I wonder what those two words mean to you?

Growth could simply as 'the process of increasing in size' or 'something that has grown or is growing'.

Renewal could be said to be 'an instance of resuming something after an interruption or the action of extending the period of validity of a licence or subscription' or even 'the replacement or repair of something'.

In church terms growth could mean increasing in numbers, influence and faith; renewal could be allowing Jesus blow away some of our faith cobwebs and ways of doing things to be more effective. I wonder what you came up with.

Just before summer the PCC agreed to accept an invitation from the diocese for the parish to join the Diocesan Renewal Programme. This is a scheme to help parishes look at themselves, how they work, what they want to achieve and find new ways of growing and being renewed. The Programme is funded by the Church of England and will cost us nothing.

Over the next 15 months a core team of myself, Joss and Stuart together with the PCC will learn to look at our parish and what we do with a view to being revitalised in mission and renewed in purpose. We will be asking questions about what we do, if we can do things better, if there are new ways of engaging with the wider parish, and if there are some things we ought to stop doing.

In terms of growth and renewal I hope taking part in the programme will;

help us grow the number of people who are part of St Michael's,

deepen our faith and help us to be bolder in sharing it,

have our faith in Jesus refreshed,

celebrate the good things we do,

and work out what new or changed ways we can live out our faith together.

We have already started the process as by the time you read this, I will have been on an induction event with Joss and Stuart, I will have shared a day with other clergy taking part in the Programme, members of the PCC have also been on a day event and Joss, Stuart and I will have been away on a Leading Your Church into Growth conference. All this is in preparation for the PCC to discuss different aspects of mission over the next 12 months and how they relate to us in Grimsargh.

Please pray for the PCC as we spend time discussing, reflecting and making decisions that will be focussed on the future of the mission our church. The theme for our PCC meetings in future will be shared beforehand so you can pray and think about each aspect. We would love to hear your inspired thoughts and insights so that we can work together in this process.

At the end we will organise a mission weekend in line with the priorities we discover and share a new mission statement for the church.

This could be an exciting and challenging time for the church. Do pray, share your thoughts, share what insights you hear from the Lord, and may we work together for our next season of mission in Grimsargh.



#### 1st November - All Saints' Day

All Saints, or All Hallows, is the feast of all the redeemed, known and unknown, who are now in heaven. When the English Reformation took place, the number of saints in the calendar was drastically reduced, with the result that All Saints' Day stood out with a prominence that it had never had before.

This feast day first began in the East, perhaps as early as the 5th century, as commemorating 'the martyrs of the whole world'. A Northern English 9th century calendar named All Hallows as a principal feast, and such it has remained. Down the centuries devotional writers have seen in it the fulfilment of Pentecost and indeed of Christ's redemptive sacrifice and resurrection.

The saints do not belong to any religious tradition, and their lives and witness to Christ can be appreciated by all Christians. Richard Baxter, writing in the 17th century, wrote the following:

He wants not friends that hath thy love, And made converse and walk with thee, And with thy saints here and above, With whom for ever I must be...

As for my friends, they are not lost; The several vessels of thy fleet, Though parted now, by tempests tost,

#### 9th November - Remembrance Sunday



In late 1914, WW1 erupted across Northern France and Flanders. Great swathes of previously green fields and forests were blasted and bombed, leaving them bleak and barren, with seemingly every living thing destroyed.

But then in the Spring of 1915, something beautiful began to come out of all the destruction. Tens of thousands of bright red Flanders poppies began to put out tentative shoots across the endless vistas of mud. These resilient little flowers had actually flourished in the middle of so much chaos and destruction, because their seeds grow when exposed to sunlight, through disturbances to soil.

We all know that these endless fields of cheerful poppies, growing in the midst of such misery and destruction, were what inspired the Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, to write the now famous poem 'In Flanders Fields'.

And it was McCrae's poem which inspired an American academic named Moina Michael to adopt the poppy in memory of those who had fallen in the war. She got it adopted as an official symbol of Remembrance across the United States, and worked with others who were trying to do the same in Canada, Australia, and the UK.

A French woman, Anna Guérin who was in the UK in 1921, caught the same vision, and planned to sell the poppies in London. There she met Earl Haig, the founder of the Royal British Legion, who was persuaded to adopt the poppy as its emblem in the UK.

The Royal British Legion, which had been formed in 1921, ordered nine million poppies and sold them on 11 November that year. Ever since then, the red poppy has been a symbol of Remembrance, of support for the Armed Forces community, and also of hope for a peaceful future

#### Exam


