PARISH LETTER

Harvest - a celebration of God's generosity

I have served most of my ministry in urban environments and so the celebration of harvest has been somewhat removed from daily life. We rarely saw crops or livestock in fields, tractors whizzing around were a rare sight, and our food came from the local supermarket or food bank, all wrapped up, with little to remind us of where it came from. If course it was still expected that we would sing 'We plough the fields and scatter'!

Being in a rural environment this year does bring home the reality of where a lot of our food comes from, in one way or another, even if the speed of some of the tractors through the village break our rural idyll. Driving through France recently enabled Louise and I to see many different crops in huge fields; maize, apples, sunflowers, onions and of course grapes.

The origins of our harvest festivals goes back to the Old Testament, indeed there is little in the New Testament about it apart from a few parables Jesus told which related to his observations on rural life. In the Old Testament the Jewish people were commanded (not asked or encouraged) to bring in a tenth of their harvest, which included livestock, and give it to God. Not only a tenth - but the first tenth. They couldn't keep back what they felt they needed and then give.

Their harvest offering was intended as a reminder of the generosity of God. He had provided them with a beautiful, plentiful land in which to settle. The response of harvest gave them a way to recognise how generous God had been, and continued to be, and was an annual reminder of His goodness to them.

Even in Grimsargh we can get complacent about God's provision when we pop off to Tesco, Asda, Booths, Sainsbury's or Aldi to stock up our cupboards. We can become very removed from where our food comes from and how God continues to sustain our world and bless us. As we become more removed from agriculture and livestock farming, we can become less thankful for God's generosity.

The packaged and processed food we consume was grown somewhere by farmers and others who have to cope with the ups and downs of weather, loneliness and government directives. (In France many signs entering villages have been turned upside down by farmers as a protest against the conflicting government statements and policies).

This year, especially at this time, let us give thanks to God for His blessings and goodness to us. Let us remember all who work with Him to provide our food. Let us rejoice at God's continuing generosity and may we respond with generosity too to those in need in any way. Lets give the first and best of what we have to God as a sign of that thankfulness.



As members of St. Michael's Mothers' Union we all promised we would remember them in our prayers, and support and encourage them!








Also during the service Josie Ainsworth, Kate Billington and Sue Chapman were enrolled into St. Michael's Mothers Union.






