Funding opportunities for Foodbanks

Live funding opportunities:

<u>Essex Community Foundation</u> - Emergency funds have been released to support charities supporting communities during the coronavirus

Morrisons - £10million worth of food for local foodbanks

Big Society Capital - plans emergency £100m loan fund for charities.

<u>Comic Relief</u> - some of the money raised through Sport Relief 2020 will go to organisations on the frontline. Support for grantees through adapting activities, reviewing timeframes, or re-budgeting remaining funds.

<u>Greggs Foundation</u> - funding for emergency food parcels, hardship payments and other support to schools and community hubs.

<u>Leathersellers Company</u> - prioritise applications from UK registered charities supporting the homeless or those at risk of becoming homeless, provision of food and essential supplies, victims of domestic violence, nursing care to vulnerable patients.

National Lottery - announces all the funding decisions for next 6 months (up to £300m) will be devoted to crisis and they will accelerate the cash part of this funding as much as possible.

Neighbourly - micro-grants of up to £400, to support good causes that are helping communities affected by the new Coronavirus outbreak.

<u>Standard Life Foundation</u> - work directly related to crisis, addressing challenges & helping to contribute to social change which tackles financial problems and improves living standards.

<u>Sylvia Adams Charitable Trust</u> - coronavirus funding announced, no details yet. Works with young people.

Seeking donations / donations already made:

Asda - has donated £5m to its partners FareShare and the Trussell Trust. This will provide over 4 million meals to families in poverty, as well as more than 3000 charities access to free food over the next 3 months.

<u>Cadent Foundation</u> - Midlands, North West England, South Yorkshire, East of England and North London. Committed £240k to the Trussell Trust last week, ready to support other worthy causes.

Co-op - £1.5 million of essential food products to FareShare's 23 regional centres, and then supplied to a network of local community groups across the country.

Indigo Trust - has donated £1m to the <u>Trussell Trust</u> for food banks.

<u>The National Emergencies Trust</u> - launching an appeal to help those most effected by the outbreak. They collaborate with charities and other bodies to raise and distribute money and support victims at the time of a domestic disaster.
