## **Our Campaigning Works!**

We congratulate Blackburn group members for gaining Asset of Community Value (ACV) listing for their community green space, ahead of a local plan consultation. The society's case officer, Nicola Hodgson, recommended that the group prepare the ACV bid in addition to, and in support of, a Local Green Space designation application for which the group continues to gather evidence of community use (Covid-19 restrictions permitting) to strengthen its case.

As a case officer, and as a voluntary researcher into historical rights of way in East Kent, I want to find out what places look like without having to travel to see them — especially now, while we're all confined to home. Google Streetview is immensely useful, but the Streetview drivers are a timorous bunch, seldom penetrating gated or unsealed public roads nor travelling rights of way. Whereas Geograph.co.uk has been everywhere, with over six million images for the British Isles — many of them taken along rights of way or on access land far from the gaze of the Streetview car. The photographs are all rigorously located on the Ordnance Survey map, which makes searching straightforward, and they can be reused with attribution under the Creative Commons Licence. You'll even find some of my own submissions in there!




# Great reads...
