CCTV cameras

Your councillors have been looking at ways to tackle some of the dangers for cyclists, pedestrians, and vehicles on the stretch of main road between the reservoir and Asturian Gate. We've contacted Lancashire County Council about speed limits and road signage. We've taken advice on various accident prevention ideas. There is a scheme to support Parish Councils interested in installing CCTV cameras and nine other local Parish Councils are interested in bidding for funds. We'd like to hear your thoughts about installing cameras on the Corporation Arms junction and at the top of Hothersall Lane. The idea is that they would act as a deterrent to reckless motorists and would enable us to build a body of evidence to make the case for a lower speed limit on that section of the main road. Please contact any of your councillors with your thoughts before the end of March.

Corporal Andy Reid MBE lost both his legs and an arm after standing on an IED pressure plate whilst serving with the 3rd Battalion, The Yorkshire Regiment in Afghanistan in 2009. Andy has always had a positive mindset that he is a



survivor not a victim and works tirelessly raising funds others to help through his charity The Standing Tall Foundation. Andy has achieved many things despite his disability but the biggest one yet was summiting Mount Kilimanjaro in October 2023

with Vicki Bateman his prosthetist and a rehab team. Vicki will be giving a talk on this massive achievement at our Annual Meeting (see above).

In his various careers as teacher, head teacher, student mentor and latterly senior steward at PNE, Steve's kindly, determined manner helped so many people to be the best that they could be, and he will be fondly remembered by so many in all walks of life.



When Steve joined the parish council many years ago, it wasn't for any selfgain but because he felt a duty to help keep Hothersall the special place we know it to be. Steve served as chairman of the council and was Mr. Reliable, if he said he would do something, he

did it with a quiet efficiency, on some occasions he was the only one who turned up for the spring litter pick!! He represented the council at many and various meetings and served his fellow residents admirably.

He served as chairman of governors during a very difficult period at Hillside School and fought determinedly to make LCC see sense over the lack of speed restriction past the school. Sadly, the stupidity of the rules prevailed.

Devoted to Christine, his girls and his grandchildren, Steve found so much happiness in life's simple pleasures, latterly developing their beautiful garden into a very special tranquil corner.

His life ended as he had lived with determination and still a sense of humour. Even in the darkest days, time spent with Steve was time well spent.

We have lost Steve far too soon, but our lives have been enriched by having known him. Thank you, Steve.
