THE LANES IN THE EIGHT CENSUSES 1841-1911 THIS PERIOD COVERS THREE FAMILIES

They had fourteen children of whom 8 survived to adulthood and one died at the age of 13

They lived at Kings Bromley Hall. John Newton Lane's mother Sarah [1765-1855] lived with the family and is credited as head of the family in the 1851 census.

They had seven children, one died young

They lived at Lily Hill, which was owned by Susan Anne and at Kings Bromley Hall and after the death of John Newton Lane appear to have used Kings Bromley as either a summer residence or as a holiday retreat. JHB Lane spent considerable sums of money on KB Hall in 1873/4 (turbine, drains, tower), 1878 (glasshouses), as did JHHV/Susan Anne in 1890 (kitchen, bathrooms, heating, electric light from turbine).

Agnes, John Newton Lane's mother stayed with her sons Sidney at Baldersby and Ernald at Leigh but also had a room at KB, probably until her death in 1885.

The family was living at Lily Hill in the 1871, 1881 and 1891 censuses

John Henry Bagot Lane, born 1829, therefore 12, is not in census, presumably abroad.

There is no mention of the lodges or of a gamekeeper, but there is of the "Fighting Cocks" run by Arthur William, publican who had a wife and six children. Since the Fighting Cocks is known to have been inside what became the Park, and the three Lodges are all mentioned in the 1851 census, it maybe that the final creation of the Park, with its walls and lodges occurred between 1841 and 1851. Webbs map, 1810 may have been more of an intention than an actuality.

Hannah Humpage also appears in the 1851 and 1861 censuses. In the 1851 census she is described as a "Dame de Compagnie", which suggests she was a companion of blind Sarah Lane. Sarah Lane died in 1855, but Hannah Humpage was still living at the Hall in 1861, described as a 'visitor'. She was godmother to Ernald Lane.

Arthur Lewis Lane died in 1846, at the age of 6.

Agnes Lane, who had her last child, Isobel in 1849, is listed as living at Blithfield Hall with her father Lord William Bagot, two brothers, a sister and 21 servants. All of John Newton Lane's children are at home apart from the eldest John Henry Bagot Lane. He may be away at school, but has not yet been found on the census. Susan Anne Vincent, 10, who will become Mrs John Henry Bagot Lane is living at Thornwood Lodge with her

father, Henry William Vincent, 54, Queen's Remembrancer of the Exchequer, magistrate for ? and barrister not practicing. Lily Hill just has 3 servants living in it.

Sarah died in 1855, John Newton Lane is now head of the family

John Henry Bagot Lane, 32, is an officer, Lieut & Capn Coldstream Guards at North Camp, Aldershot, Herts **Cecil Newton Lane**, 28, was resident in Cephalonia 1860-1864

Greville Charles, 27, is not in the census, presumably abroad. He saw active service in the Crimean War (1853-1856) the Indian Mutiny 1857

Ernald, 25, is not in the census, presumably abroad

Edward had died at sea in 1854

The Manor, KB

Susan Anne Vincent, 28, is a visitor at New Lodge Mansion, Oxford with John Sylvan van de?, 59, Envoy?, a Belgian. He has a wife and 5 children, 3 other visitors and many servants. Susan's father Henry William Vincent, 64 is at Lily Hill. She was to marry John Henry Bagot Lane in 1864.

1871 Census, 2nd April

John Newton Lane had died in 1869, his successor, JHB Lane, now has two houses, Kings Bromley Hall & Lily Hill. In the 1869 probate three of the rooms at the KB Hall are called Cecil's room, Ronald's room and Captn. Grenville's room.

Agnes Lane, 61, now two years a widow and JHB's sister **Isabel Beatrice**, 22, (who would marry, Percy Brodrick Bernard, in 1872) were visiting **Sidney Leveson Lane**, 40, at Baldersby Park, Ripon. Sidney was a barrister who had married, in 1863, Mary the widow of the William Dawnay, 7th Viscount Downe who had died in 1857. She was a Bagot, born at Blithbury, and had, by, Dawnay, 8 sons and 2 daughters. In the 1871 census living at Baldersby are Sidney's stepchildren Guy, 22, Eustace, 20, William, 19, Geoffrey, 18, Francis, 17, Alice 15, and Edith, 14. The oldest stepson Hugh was 27, only 12 years younger than Sidney was away, apparently abroad persuing his military career. Also at Baldersby are Sidney and Mary's children Sidney, 7, and Mary 5. The retinue at Baldersby Park consists of a governess and 30 servants.

John Henry Bagot Lane, 42, had married **Susan Anne Vincent** of Lily Hill in 1864 and has set up at Lily Hill, his wife's house. He had bought himself out of his commission with the Coldstream Guards in 1867. His first three children were born in Kensington, France and Eaton Place London, respectively but his fourth was born at Bracknell as were all of the rest of their children. JHB's brother **Grenville** is living at KB Hall as a possibly injured half pay captain with a small staff, 2 grooms, 4 house servants and a medical attendant. The gardens are, however being kept up.

Cecil Newton, 38, is living at Lily Hill, he had been resident at Cephalonia from 1860-64. Susan Anne Lane's watercolour of 1878 shows 'Cecil's Room' at KB Hall. He married in 1876, so presumably he lived with the family, either at Lily Hill or at KB Hall from 1864 to 1876.

Greville Charles, 37, is living at KB Hall as half pay captain and possible invalid, he died in 1878.

Ernald 35, became rector of Leigh in 1871, in the census he is living in the rectory with 3 servants.

Edith Emmeline 25, In 1868 Edith married Walter James who became Baron Northbourne. They are living at Updown House in the Parish of Ham, Sandwich, Kent. Walter (25) is listed as a Barrister.

Ronald Bertram, 24, Is listed as living at the Infantry Barracks, Woolwich, as a Lieutenant, Rifle Brigade.

JHHV Lane, 13, is living in Dover at school.

Sidney Leveson Lane, 49, is head of the family at Baldersby Park, a barrister (not in practice) and a magistrate. Living with him are his wife, Lady Downe (55), step daughter Edith Dawnay, daughter Mary, three step garnd-daughters and a step grandson. The establishment at Baldersby includes 27 servants, 3 gardeners and a gamekeeper. Hugh Downe, the heir had considerable estates in Yorkshire, where his seat was Danby Lodge, Grosmont and bought in August, 1883, for about £175, 000, the estate of Dingley, Market Harborough, of about 5,000 acres: he was clearly content, at this time, for his mother and stepfather to live at Baldersby, the old family home.

Cecil Newton Lane, 47, married in 1876 and is now living at Whiston Hall, Shropshire with his wife Adela, 36, and two children Newton Frederick Seymour, 1, and Percy Ernald, 3 months. Their establishment consists of a lady's maid, cook, housemaid, nurse and coachman/gardener. He is described in the census as: CMG, J.P. for Salop, Col. on retired list, ? forces, land agent.

Ernald, 46, is living at Leigh with his mother **Agnes**, 71, wife Evelyn, 24, daughter Beatrice, 1, and 8 servants. **Edith**, 35, is living with husband Walter James, 35, now an MP, at the London house of his father Walter James, Bart., 6, Whitehall Gardens, Westminster. Edith and Walter have four children: Sarah, 10, Cuthbert, 9, Robert, 8, Wilfred, 6. There are 12 servants at the house.-

Ronald Bertram, 34, is not in the census. He was probably abroad on active service? He was Aide de Camp to the Duke of Connaught (Prince Arthur) as Commander of the Guards' Brigade in Egypt in 1882 and Assistant Military Secretary in Canada in 1883.

Isabel Beatrice had died in 1876

Sidney Leveson Lane, 59, is living at Puckaster House, Niton, Isle of Wight, with his wife, Mary Isobel Downe, 65, daughter Mary, 25 and stepdaughter Alice Dawneye, 35. He is described as living on his own means. Baldersby Hall appears to be mothballed with only Stephen Lambert, Hall Porter, as head with three other servants, but there is still a stables with a coachman, groom, parkgate keeper and retired parkgate keeper and a bothy and gardeners house with four gardeners. Stephen Lambert has a similar skeleton staff in 1911.

Cecil Newton Lane, 57, is living at Whiston Hall, Salop, with his wife, Adela, 45, sons Newton ,11, and Percy, 10, John Ronald, 6 and daughter Georgina A.J., 9.

Ernald Lane, 55 is living at Leigh rectory with his wife Evelyn, son Geoffrey,8, and daughter Marjorie,4. He is now Archdeacon of Stoke as well as Rector of Leigh. Where is Beatrice M A Lane, born 1880?

Edith James, 45, is living at 6 Whitehall Gardens with her husband, William James, M.P., sons Robert, 17, Wilfred 16, and seven servants.

Ronald Bertram Lane 44 is not in the 1891 census, he must be abroad

Florence Louisa, 26 married in 1886 the Hon. Frederick William Anson, fourth son of Thomas George, Earl of Lichfield and Georgina Louisa (née Hamilton). There is no census record for her in 1891, so they were probably abroad.. She died in 1908, they had three sons and three daughters, the first born in 1892.

Arthur Edward Cecil, 19, is recorded as living as a boarder student with the Reverend Henry B Hodgson at The Vicarage, Thornbury, Glos., with another three students.

1901 Census Sunday 31st March

A time of transition.

Susan Anne Lane died in 1899. On her death JHHV Lane was 34 and he inherited Lily Hill and the rest of her estate, worth £14.759.

JHHV Lane (34) himself is in the 1901 census as a visitor at Broad Oak, Farnham, Guildford, Surrey as the guest of a Robert M Howard. He would marry Grace Louisa Edwards daughter of the 4th Baron Kensington in 1902 and sell Lily Hill on behalf of himself and his younger brothers and sisters to a Charles Neck.

Grace Louisa Edwardes (29) is recorded as living at St. Bride's Castle, Pembroke, with her mother, the widowed Grace Elizabeth, Baroness Kensington, and her sisters Sybil and Isobel brother George Henry, two cousins and an establishment of 19 servants.

Of JHHV's brothers and sisters:

- **1.Florence Louisa Jane** (36) had married, in 1886, Hon. Frederick William Anson, fourth son of Thomas George, Earl of Lichfield. They had three sons and three daughters. She is recorded as living at Cell Barnes, St. Peters, St. Albans, Herts. with her husband Frederick William Anson (Justice of the Peace) their three sons Ernald Henry, 7, Arthur, 5, and Frederick, 5, and two daughters, Helen Frances, 8, and Sibyl Florence, 6 all 5 born at St. Albans. Frederick's brother, Henry James(42), a major in the Highland Light Infantry was living with them. Their living in establishment was a butler, footman, housemaid, kitchen maid, cook, three nurses, a coachman and three gardeners.
- 2. Constance (32) is listed in the 1901 census as living as a boarder at the Rectory, Barton Beacons,
- Northamptonshire, with the family of John Marsham, 58, and his wife Penelope, two daughters Grace, 23 and Olive 20 and three servants. She is listed as being 31, having been born at Lily Hill, Berks and as 'living on own means' and being 'feeble minded'
- **3.Arthur Edward Cecil** (29) is recorded as a boarder at Belle Vue house, Lympne, St. Stephens, Kent as a timber merchant and employer
- **4.George Alfred Osborne** (26) had joined the Coldstream Guards, as a career, in 1897. He is recorded as a Lieutenant in the Coldstream Guards, at the District School of Musketry, St.Leonards, Hythe, Kent, with 17 other officer/students.
- **5.Lilian Emily Isabel** (23) is visiting, or living with, her aunt Edith James, Lady Northbourne at 47, Courtfield Gardens, Kensington. She was to marry Walter Bromley Davenport in 1902.

Of his surviving uncles and aunt:

- **1. Sidney Leveson Lane** (69). His wife "Minnie", Lady Downe, had died on 14th April 1900. In 1901 he was living at Tansher Ter Glen House, Rockend, North Berwick, East Lothian, Scotland with his stepdaughter Alice J. Dawnay, living on his own means, with a retinue of 9 servants. (This is from the Scottish census which has been transcibed by the National Archive, but you cannot look at actual image- the house name is probably mis transcribed and is actually Glen House, Tantallon Terrace). He died in 1910 at Great Addington, Northants.
- **2**. **Ernald Lane** (65) was living at Leigh Rectory with his wife Evelyn, 44, and daughter Marjorie(14). His son Geoffrey Ernald was 18, and a 2nd. Lieutenant in the Rifle Brigade.
- **2. Edith Emmeline Mary James**, Lady Northbourne (55), is living with her husband, Walter James, 2nd Baron Northbourne, 55, her niece, **Lilian Lane** and a retinue of ten servants.
- **3. Ronald Bertram Lane** (54). He had married Augusta Sarah Beaumont in 1893 when he was 46. He is not in the 1901 census, he is probably abroad.

Lily Hill. In the 1901 census the head of the house at Lily Hill is the gardener, with his wife, two sons, also gardeners, and three younger children. It would be sold in 1902.

Kings Bromley. This would soon become JHHV's family home and has a caretaker, lodgekeeper, gamekeeper and four gardeners. William Henry Boden, who was butler in 1911 is living in the village

Constance Lane, 41, is living at "Fotheringay", De La Mare Parade, Bexhill on Sea. She is described as a visitor. Also at this address are a companion, Sarah Ralph, "companion" a housekeeper, his wife, a male nurse, a male attendant, a retired Colonel and his wife and three domestic servants. The house has 20 rooms.

Arthur Edward Cecil Lane, 39,. is living on his own at 10 Mansions, Ceswichaw, Shawnigan, Nanaimo, Vancouver Island as head of household and a farmer.

Lilian, 33, had married Walter Bromley Davenport in 1902, she is living with her unmarried brother-in-law, William Bromley Davenport, at 6 St. Auben's Gardens, Hove with her mother-in-law and three children Walter Henry, Arthur Richard and Edward - the first two recorded as having been born at Capesthorne and the last at Torquay.
