New Novice Rule For Our Shows

A Novice, in the eyes of the Society, is EITHER a) an exhibitor who, since reaching the age 18, has not won one of the Trophies listed in the Year Book (except Novice Trophies) for a similar class in any horticultural show in earlier calendar years OR b) an exhibitor who is 18 years or younger at the end of the calendar year.

A Novice remains a Novice until the end of the calendar year.

Novice Trophy winners should be excluded from winning the same trophy for the next 2 years.
