Definitions

This page is here to help clarify certain terms used in the schedules and elsewhere, which have proven to be points of contention in the past.

If, having read these definitions, you are at all uncertain about any aspect of these or other terms you have encountered, please ask the Show Secretary for further clarification.

It is particularly important not to make any assumptions about exhibiting - therein lies potential disappointment...

- Roses, peas & onions are kinds.
- HT, Cluster and Miniature are Types (of rose).
- "Peace", "Super Star" and "Ena Harkness" are varieties of their type of rose (HT).
- A flower variety may be of mixed colours.
- A "Herbaceous" plant is a plant which does not form a persistent woody stem. It may be annual, biennial or perennial.
- A "Perennial" is a plant that lasts for more than two years.
- The following kinds of vegetable may be used as "Saladings":

American Cress, Beetroot, Cabbages, Carrots, Celeriac, Celery, Chicory, Chives, Corn Salad/Lamb's Lettuce, Cress, Cucumbers, Blanched Dandelion, Endive, Florence Fennel, Kohl Rabi, Lettuces, Mustard/Rape, Green Salad Onions, Potatoes, Radishes, Sweet Peppers, Tomatoes, Turnips and Watercress.

• "Bowl" - a vessel for displaying cut flowers in water or for growing bulbous plants and having a mouth-width measurement at least equal to, but, usually greater than, its height.
