Title of article or notice:	Alcohol Awareness Week 3-9 July - support

Short summary	Alcohol Awareness Week in July is a chance for people in Kingston to get thinking about drinking. The harm caused by alcohol affects millions of people every year in the form of health problems and financial worries. In Kingston, alcohol is the 3rd highest risk factor for ill health in adults aged 20 to 69.  Kingston e-drink-check is a confidential and anonymous tool that can help Kingston residents, workers and students find out how much alcohol they drink, what this means for their health and how to get help if needed. If someone feels their drinking is getting out of control and they want to speak to someone, Kingston Wellbeing Service provide confidential advice, tailored support and information around alcohol.

Title of article or notice:	NHS Healthy Start

Short summary	Healthy Start provides a prepaid card for eligible women who are pregnant, or families who have a child under 4. The beneficiary receives £4.25 per week to help towards the cost of fruit, vegetables, pulses, milk and formula, as well as providing access to free vitamins.

Around one third of eligible residents in Kingston are not accessing this support each month. In 2021 it was estimated that if a family signs up from the first opportunity (when pregnant), to when the child turns 4, this equates to approximately £1,250 per family.
