Title of article or notice:	Coronation Pageant on Sunday May 7th

Short summary	A big event to celebrate the Coronation is being planned for May 7th. This is being called a Coronation Pageant and is being organised by All Saints in partnership with the Council, Kingston Music Service, the Rose Theatre and Kingston First.
	It will start with some street theatre at 3pm featuring a re-enactment of the Coronation of King Athelstan in the Memorial Gardens by members of the Rose Youth Theatre. At 3.30pm there will be a carnival vibe in the Market Square with Kingston Music Service leading a 'junk percussion samba'. There will also be traditional fairground rides and cream teas in the churchyard. The event will culminate in a Service of Thanksgiving at 4.30pm at All Saints Church. This will include some school choirs singing alongside our church choir.
	A key theme that connects Athelstan's coronation and Charles' III is that of unifying people. The Saxon Kings chose Kingston for their coronations because it was on the border of Wessex and Mercia, the two kingdoms that they were bringing together. Charles III is known for his sponsorship and encouragement of interfaith relations, bringing together people of different faiths, viewpoints and cultures.
