	Local charities, community groups, voluntary organisations, sports clubs, Guides and Brownies are already raising funds with the lottery and their supporters can win up to £25,000.
	For every £1 ticket bought, 60p goes straight to good causes in Kingston, such as: Kingston Carers Network, Kingston Centre for Independent Living, The Community Brain and many more. Over 80 local good causes are using Kingston's Community Lottery as part of their fundraising approach, raising over £23,700.
	Thanks to support from the lottery, Kingston Carers Network, have achieved 96% of their fundraising target. Kingston Carers Network say:
