## **Advanced notice: Traffic Signal Upgrade – A176 Noak Hill Road, Billericay**

We are writing to advise you that preparations are being made to upgrade the signalised pedestrian crossing on A176 Noak Hill Road, south of St Agnes Road, Billericay. Works are due to start on **Monday 4 August 2025**.

Our aim is to renew the traffic signals before they become unreliable and fail to work properly by replacing the aging poles and equipment. Upgrading the traffic signals using extra low voltage equipment will also help to reduce our carbon footprint.

These works will be carried out overnight between the hours of **7pm and 5am** to limit the impact on local businesses and commuters. Temporary multi-way traffic signals will be necessary during the working hours to ensure a safe working area together with providing a safe crossing facility for pedestrians. We will endeavour to complete the noisiest operations by 11pm, with other activities continuing for the remainder of the shift.

Lane restrictions will be removed when work is not taking place during the day and the temporary traffic signals will remain in place to ensure a safe crossing point is available for pedestrians.

We expect our work will be complete by mid-August 2025, however dates may be subject to change if we experience unsuitable weather conditions or if unexpected issues arise.

We urge all drivers to take additional care and observe traffic management and signage in place during the works.
