The PC is still pursuing the 40 PMH restriction, plus the problem of potholes around the village and the water problems in Rectory Road. The telephone

box will be renovated with new coat of paint, this incidentally is a working phone box, should any one need it. The finger posts will be smartened up with fresh paint and it is hoped that you will have noticed improvements in the cutting of the verges, also the signage for the village has all been replaced. With the organising by John Ellis and his team of



Conservators the PC are still hoping for the construction of a footpath from the Dukes Head towards Noak Hill Road. There is a newly proposed timed street lighting programme through out Essex, this will affect Little Burstead Parish. It has been suggested that lighting will be off from midnight until 5am. However, for safety, all road junctions and other darker spots will remain lit. It is hoped that this will save your money and also make a contribution with environment in mind.

### **NEWS FROM THE COMMON MAN**

October will see a burst of activity on the Common as contractors are due to start work on some of the projects for which we have received a grant from the Veolia North Thames Trust. These include the provision of two paths ,a small bridge, the digging of two wildlife ponds, restoration of the ancient well,the



reintroduction of the sheep and a new seating area. The summer has proved a good one for butterflies and the list of those now recorded on the Common has reached 24 different species.

Several Rowan trees were donated. by Waitrose and have been planted close to the council car park. It is hoped that the berries will attract wintering thrushes and perhaps waxwings in the future. Waxwings were seen this year in the Wiggins lane area feeding on berries so we are hopeful. Excavation of the well, which is around 200 years continues and the local blacksmith is currently making the safety grid. It is planned that water from the well will supply the two ponds.

Work on the ponds has been delayed whilst gas, water and electricity authorities discover where the power, gas and water services are located. Following the soil scraping and tree felling the new growth of gorse and plants from the original seed bank are beginning to show. However, the real enemy are the brambles which we hope to eliminate by volunteer labour!

The Conservators have applied for an additional grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund and if successful will be used in part to provide a natural footpath from the Dukes Head to Noak Hill Road. They have been working in unison with the Parish Council to achieve this goal. **John Ellis**
