



Dear Lewes Swift Supporters,

#### Welcome back to the Swifts!

We hope to see Swifts returning to Lewes by the end of this month and to celebrate their arrival we are organising a "Welcome Back" parade on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> April. You are very welcome to join in – just meet us at the Linklater Pavilion at 10.30 a.m. for a short walk up to Lewes Climate Hub, 32 High Street. It would be wonderful if you could bring along a "Flying Swift" or a placard!





We have been very busy organising six weeks of events to share the importance of keeping Lewes as a "Swift-friendly Town for Nature Recovery". All events will be at the wonderful space at Lewes Climate Hub in Lewes House, 32 High Street. The season opens on 23<sup>rd</sup> April, with special visitors and activities every Saturday until 31<sup>st</sup> May to encourage actions to boost biodiversity. All events are free – sponsored by Chalk Cliff Trust.

## Saturday 26th April – A Summer with Swifts, Swallows and Martins

Following the pavement parade you can add to our Mosaic Wall and make a flying Swift, a Swift mobile or a Swift pendant.

Then, at 1.30 p.m., Paul Stevens will give his talk: "A Summer with Swifts, Swallows and Martins", sharing wonderful videos of the Swifts and House Martins that have colonised his house.

A Swift-friendly town will bring benefits to lots of other birds and wildlife too!









### Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> May - Ponds for Wildlife



As I am sure that you know, one of the challenges to Swifts is the fall in the population of the insects and airborne invertebrates that they feed upon. Ponds are great for Insects, invertebrates and other wildlife and on Saturday 3rd May at 1.30 p.m. Pete Birchall, (Pete the Pond), will talk about "The importance of ponds for wildlife".

## Saturday 10th May - The Lewes Mosaic Project

To sustain our wildlife, it is essential that we cultivate bigger, better and well-connected green spaces.

The Lewes Mosaic Project is a collaboration between the Railway Land Wildlife Trust, Common Cause Cooperative, Wildflower Lewes, Lewes Urban Arboretum and Lewes Swift Supporters.

We want to help build a mosaic of habitats right across the town, providing homes and food for our wonderful wildlife and bringing the town to life!

On Saturday 10th May, Helen Meade, (Railway Land CEO), will share information about how you may help to make this a reality through adding to the Lewes Mosaic for Nature.

## Saturday 17th May - Step into the Wild Time Machine!

On Saturday 17th May, join the People's Park for Nature team at Lewes Climate Hub and help them build a Wild Time Machine – powered by your wild memories and dreams for the future!

Dylan Walker, ecologist and community rewilding expert from Peoples' Park for Nature, explains:

"At the People's Park for Nature, we're on a mission to reconnect people and places with the wild. Join us to dream big and build a wilder future! What wildlife once roamed our local spaces? Share your stories and ideas, and together we'll create a magical, sensory experience that brings the wild past and future to life – the sights, sounds, and even tastes!"

Did you know that Buglife research suggests that the population of insects and invertebrates has fallen by 79% since 2004? Since parent Swifts need an estimated 20,000 insects a day when they are feeding their chicks, this has the potential to be a huge factor in their decline. To round off our season, we are very pleased to be able to welcome expert Alice Parfitt from Buglife to give her presentation at 1.30 p.m. on 31st May: "Why Bugs Matter". ## The "Wild Card" rewilding campaign

Do you like making things?

Rewilding campaign Wild Card is asking people to get involved in a bit of 'craftivism' to persuade the Church of England to rewild more of the 105,000 acres of land held in its investment portfolio. It is asking people, groups and schools to knit, paint or model animals that could be saved by rewilding, then send them to the Church Commissioners between World Rewilding Day, (20<sup>th</sup> March), and Easter Sunday, (20<sup>th</sup> April). - What were the Swifts doing, for example, screaming, entering a nest space, flying quietly?

#### Thinking of installing a nest box?

If you live in Lewes and are thinking of installing a Swift nest box or an artificial House Martin cup, this is how we might support you – if your building proves to be suitable and there is access for a long ladder.

- Funding a Swift box and the installation when someone lives next to an existing Swift colony.
- If you do not live next to an existing colony, we still offer support and advice on installing a Swift nest box. We visit the homeowner to find out if the building and location are suitable and help to decide on the best place for a box. At current prices, this would cost you £48 for a single box and £25 for the installation. See: <a href="https://www.peakboxes.co.uk/shop">https://www.peakboxes.co.uk/shop</a>
- A free House Martin cup and installation for anyone who lives in a suitable location in an existing colony so that we might encourage expansion of the existing colony.
