




Dear Swift Supporters,

Welcome back to our Swifts!

At the time of writing, we have recorded Swifts returning to three known nest sites in Lewes. On 25th April, the nest cam in Sharons' house showed one Swift returning at 8.20 p.m.

On 28th April, Audrey, Nick and Nigel all saw a Swift return to the colony at 98 Western Road at 8.24 p.m. later in the evening they were joined by Kevin, who saw a Swift exit from one of the nests at the rear of the High Street. This is very early!

Swift Watch Sightings

With the fine weather we have been having, we had some early sightings of Swifts from Swift Watchers and surveyors. Here are some of them.

21st April

- Emily, one of our new surveyors, saw a high-flying Swift over The Avenue in the evening
- Silverstick saw a Swift over the top of The Avenue, and again on 22nd

23rd April

- Sue saw her first Swift over St Swithun's Terrace.
- Emma saw two Swifts, Swallows, House Martins and \sand Martins flying over the Cockshut wetlands

27th April

- Margaret Healy spotted at least four Swifts high in the sky above Southover
- Sue saw six flying over St. Swithun's Terrace
- Piers saw three Swifts over Landport Bottom about 1.00 p.m. and later one over the Black Horse
- Michael Birt saw one Swift over 24 De Montfort Road where there is a nest box that has been used for twenty years.

28th April

- Emma Chaplin saw two Swifts screaming over number 98 Western Road at midday
- Debs saw three Swifts at the rear of the High Street at 2 noon, then six Swifts up high at 5.00 p.m.
- Liz saw her first Swifts seen above the junction of The Avenue and Bradford Road at midday.
- Lynn saw five Swifts flying over St Martin's Lane at 11.00 a.m.
- Bill saw two Swifts above 98 Western Road at 8.35 a.m.

29th April

- Susan heard and saw her first low-flying Swifts over Southover this morning 8.50 a.m.
- David saw three Swifts flying over Lansdown Place at 3.40 p.m.

A Swift-friendly Town for Nature Recovery

On Saturday 26th April, we were joined by the Mayor of Lewes, Councillor Imogen Makepeace, for a wonderful "Welcome back to the Swifts" parade from the Railway Land to Lewes Climate Hub. Thank you to everyone who came along! Your placards and flying Swifts were magnificent!

Nest box update

In March and April, we installed ten more Swift nest boxes around Lewes, and we are making site visits to plan for some more. Do get in touch if you are interested in hosting one at your home. Single Peak nest boxes cost £48 each and we charge £25 for installing them. If you live next to an existing colony and there is a chance to expand it, LSS will pay for the box and installation.
