The Brenizer Method 2

What is the Brenizer method? Combines multiple files to achieve a shallow depth of field effect in a wide-angle image Allows you to capture a shallow depth of field photo that also features a wide field of view Shoot a series of images with a telephoto lens using a wide aperture Then stitch the images together

2 : MINIMAL ART

Minimalist photography is a form of photography that is distinguished by austere simplicity.


It emphasizes sparseness and careful composition, shying away from overabundance of colour, patterns, or information





Useful for subject with great depth Especially macro images Take a series of images, moving the point of focus along the image from front to back Combine them in Photoshop Photomerge Or use Affinity





Photoshop



Affinity

Focussing can be done manually
 Use a focussing rail
 Most mirrorless cameras will mechanise the process
 Select the closest focussing position, then the rearmost and press the shutter
