- 7. CLERK'S PROGRESS UPDATE and CORRESPONDENCE TO NOTE
  - 7.1. Town and Parish Councils were invited to consider supplementary information to support their responses to the Local Plan Issues and Options (call for sites evaluations) which were originally submitted in 2021. There are no developments or changes which would amend Margaret Roding parish councils original response. The Regulation 18 consultation which will confirm preferred sites is expected to be published in the Autumn.
  - 7.2. A Town and Parish Council liaison meeting was held on 12<sup>th</sup> September and open to all Cllrs across the district, the only agenda item was an update on the Local Plan. The slides from the meeting which included timelines and outline information were circulated to Cllrs.
  - 7.3. The clerk forwarded the slides from the Uttlesford Code of Conduct training.
  - 7.4. Kemi Badenoch MP has put together a rural crime survey (<a href="https://www.kemibadenoch.org.uk/kemi-badenoch-mp-rural-crime-survey-2023">https://www.kemibadenoch.org.uk/kemi-badenoch-mp-rural-crime-survey-2023</a> with the aim of learning more about how residents within the Saffron Walden constituency are impacted by this issue. Residents are encouraged to respond.

#### 8. COUNCILLORS REPORTS to include.

#### 8.1. Environment and Health

Essex County Council is working in partnership with Essex District, Borough, and City Councils to deliver the Food Waste Recycling project across the county. During September Uttlesford households will receive a roll of caddy liners, an information leaflet and a 'no food in here please' sticker attached to their bin. The approach is designed to encourage residents to make the most of their food recycling services by highlighting the benefits of recycling food instead of throwing it away in the general rubbish and increase food recycling by 10%.

### 8.2. Transport

Essex County Council published a consultation on its Essex Electric Vehicle Charge Point Strategy. The deadline has now passed, however documents can be viewed as this link

#### 8.3. Local Government

On 31 October the second phase of changes under the Elections Act 2022 come into effect. The key changes are summarized as follows,

- All new absent vote applications (postal and proxy) must include a National Insurance number as part of the new identification requirements, whether they are made online or by paper.
- The new Government Online Voter Application portal goes live, allowing 24/7 access.
- The total number of electors for whom a person may act as a proxy will be limited to 4, of which no more than 2 can be "domestic electors" i.e., not service or overseas voters.

9.4 MAGS has extended the consultation period for stakeholders to the Stansted Airport draft noise action plan to 5<sup>th</sup> November. Guidance on matters to consider in responding has been received from Stansted Airport Watch and circulated to Cllrs.

In response to the parish council's request, Essex County Council (ECC) confirmed they would not instigate a review of the walking route at the request of the council, this has to come from a parent.

However, it was recognised the issue is primarily with vegetation. County Cllr Barker continued the correspondence. Essex Highways Officers have advised the identified vegetation defect is overgrown hedgerow near Porters Cottage, Leaden Roding. This has been passed to an Enforcement Officer to take action which will result in letters to the relevant landowners. Parish Council to consider if this is the only area of concern and if necessary, agree any further action.
