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Apologies for absence

Cllr Robert Trundle and Cllr Chris Turner sent apologies to the meeting and the apologies were accepted. Cllr Parsons has sent notice that he would be late to the meeting.

Following the January meeting Cllr Peter Briggs tendered his 'retirement' to the chair. The clerk informed Uttlesford Electoral Services who instigated the required notice period for a casual vacancy. This notice expired with no requests for an election. This leaves the parish council free to co-opt a replacement.

Cllr Phillips proposed agenda item 6 be brought forward as the meeting was not quorate and this item is reporting only, there were no objections.

County and District Cllr Report

Local Government Reform currently the suggestion for 5 unitary councils has the highest support, this would give c.350,000 population per council, the government target is for c.500,000. Current proposals would see Uttlesford combine with Epping (mostly green belt) and Harlow (little land for development).

In terms of the elections timetable, May 2025 Essex County Council elections are postponed, in May 2026 there will be an election for a Greater Essex mayor and in May 2027 the district elections will be cancelled and replaced with elections to form the unitaries. These unitaries will shadow existing councils for a year and be fully operational in 2028.

The Local Plan inspection has begun and hearings are scheduled for the summer.

Currently the Local Highways Panel do not have a confirmed budget for this year. The application to reinforce the existing speed limit through Margaret Roding is included in the list of projects.

The register of interests was completed and forwarded to Uttlesford and Clir Chaplain was provided with the Code of Conduct, Standing Orders and Financial Regulations. Clerk's Progress Update and Correspondence Chelmsford City Council has consulted (closed 18th March) on its Local Plan pre submission Regulation 19, prior to submission to the planning inspector. The plan was adopted in 2020, and this is a statutory five-year update. The documents can be viewed on the Chelmsford City Council website. MAGs have launched a public consultation (pre planning application) with a proposal to increase passenger numbers from the approved 43million/annum to 51million/annum. This to be achieved by making best use of the existing 'single numay within the same boundaries and no more flights than currently allowed'. Dunmow area parish meeting where Uttesford provide updates to clerks and clirs takes place on 2nd April, topics for update are Local Plan. Community Infrastructure Levy and Devolution and Local Government Reform. Essex Police requested expressions of interest from Parish Councils interested in jointly funding a Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) by mid-February.
