From Canon John D Brown:

Dear Residents of the Parish of Margaretting,

For those of you who do not know me, I was the Priest in Charge ('Vicar') of St. Margaret's, Margaretting, from September 1992 until October 1999. I lived with my wife Sue in the Vicarage in Pennys Lane.

It was my privilege recently to officiate at the Funeral and Thanksgiving Service for John Currie, a very significant member over a number of years of Margaretting's community – a farmer, a Chairman of the Parish Council, and a Churchwarden of St. Margaret's Church. Margaretting Church was packed for the service, for many there was standing room only within the Church, and some stood outside. One member of the congregation, clearly a visitor, asked me if such an attendance was a common feature of the Church? I found myself responding: 'Sadly, No!'

My reason for writing this letter, to be distributed to all the residents of the Parish, is to bring to your attention my deep anxiety about the future of Margaretting's Church with respect to its continuance to be the community's place for worship on a Sunday. I was not aware until recently that just prior to the departure last autumn of the Revd. Jean Halliday, it was decided that on account of the poor attendance at the weekly Sunday Service, Services would generally only be held on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month, it being considered discourteous to those being invited to lead worship on the 2nd and 4th Sundays if the congregation consisted of only a small handful of people and some of these not resident in the parish.

Margaretting's Church has always suffered as a result of its geographical location. Without a car or bicycle it is inaccessible to the majority. Indeed when during the late '90s I was leading its Services, some congregation members were regularly picked up from the village and brought to the Church by minibus. Furthermore I am very much aware that during

recent years some of Margaretting's key residents have moved away or died, and others have not chosen to 'put on their shoes.'

My question is: 'To what extent are today's residents of Margaretting concerned as to the future of their Parish Church?' I have pledged myself to the extent that I am able to underwrite the provision of worship on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month until such times as a decision is made as to a future pattern of ministry which may or may not include Margaretting. I long that whether or not you are interested in attending Margaretting Church, you nevertheless feel you 'own' it as a very significant component within village life. Some of you may have been baptised there, married there, attended funerals there; some of you may have been present at services of worship on particular occasions, Christmas, Easter, Harvest Festival, or as a result of your children being educated at Margaretting School.

I would welcome residents e-mailing me: canonjbrown@mac.com or 'phoning me 01245 358185, or writing to me at 556, Galleywood Road, Chelmsford, CM2 8BX. I would be very happy to chair a public meeting when we could talk about 'your Church', since as residents of Margaretting, St.Margaret's is your Church. We are told that many people these days are seeking space, time for quiet, answers to difficult questions. Margaretting Church offers responses to all of these. The Services of the Church are not set in stone: there is room for flexibility both in time and content. But unless people say what they want their Church to be for them, there is a real danger the Church will continue to answer questions which are not being asked, and fail to hear those which are, and as the ultimate, Margaretting Church may be permanently shut.

So here is both my very deep concern which I hope you also share, and my invitation. I look forward to hearing from you.

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - MARCH MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Three members of the public were present. Matters raised included the Flood Alleviation Scheme and recent Police activity at a property in Maldon Road.

REDUCED SPEED LIMITS FOR WANTZ ROAD, WRITTLE ROAD AND MARGARETTING ROAD

The survey results and our proposal for a lower speed limit will be considered by Local Highways Panel at its April meeting.

A12 SLIP ROAD

Reports of someone occupying the wooden shed which has been erected on the raised verge adjacent to the A414 have been reported to Essex Highways. A sliver car has been seen parked along side the shed.

BRIDLEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Parsonage Lane: The flooding problem caused by a blocked ditch in the verge in front of 'The Parsonage' is to be sorted out by the owners private contractors. Essex Highways do not have the funds to carry out this work.

BUS SHELTERS

A litter bin is to be installed for the new shelter outside the Red Lion. We have asked the Essex Highways' Transport Officer to arrange a temporary stop whilst the shelter opposite the Black Bull is being repaired.

ALLOTMENTS & PLAY AREA

Youths from outside the village, having parked their cars in Maldon Road, have been seen gathering in the youth shelter. Litter is being thrown on the grass and not in the litter bins.

FLOOD ALLEVIATION SCHEME

Preliminary works have started and Margaretting Tye residents have had cause to make a number of complaints to the Environment Agency (EA) about the damage being done to Swan Lane. It is understood the EA and Essex Highways, to prevent further damage, will be carrying out road repairs/improvements. It was reported that a contractor's lorry had been seen driving through the village and contractors are working on Sundays. At our last meeting the parish council was assured by the EA that no vehicles would access Swan Lane via the village and there would be no Sunday working.

Clearance works to west side of river Wid has started. The number of mature trees due to be felled is still provoking feelings of anger and resentment because the extent of the tree felling had not been made clear when we attended the planning committee's site visit. Also, the planning committee's PA system was so poor when the scheme was being considered that no one in the public seating area could hear what was being said about the trees. And, despite EA assurances there would be silent piling the house owners most affected by the scheme have now been told this may not be the case.

- Make your home look like someone is living in it. Don't close your curtains - in daytime this shows the house is empty. Use automatic timer-switches to turn your lights on when it goes dark.
- Cancel any milk or newspaper delivers.
- Avoid discussing holiday plans where strangers may hear details of your absence.
- Cut the lawn before you go and trim back any plants that burglars could hide behind.
- Uncollected mail is a sign that you are away. The Royal Mail 'Keepsafe' service (0845 7777 888) will keep your mail for up to 66 days while you are away.
- Consider leaving important documents and valuable items with other family members or a bank.
- Do not put your home address on your luggage when you are travelling to your holiday destination.
- If you normally leave valuable pedal cycles or similar items in your shed, consider putting them in the house
- Finally, make sure that you've locked all outside doors and windows and, if you have a burglar alarm, make sure it is set.
