Parsonage Lane: A meeting is being arranged with Chelmer Housing Partnership to discuss the damage to the green in front of Glenside Cottages. Main Road: The parish cleansing team will be in the village on Thursday, 12 May. The team will tidy up the footpath on Peacocks side of the road. It was noted that this grass verge receives two cuts a year by Chelmsford City Council Three Mile Hill: The results of the speed survey (LCH142076) showed that the average speed was 50mph. Considering the high volume of cars using this road this suggests a large number of cars are exceeding the speed limit.

Public Rights of Way: A survey of the village footpaths is currently being undertaken by Cllr. Harry Blurton and Michael Scott. The results will be reported to Chelmsford City Council. Pot Holes: The pot holes in Swan Lane, Ivy Barn Lane and at the Wantz Road/Main Road Junction are to be reported to Highways.
