DEMOCRATIC TIME

Four members of the public present. The following matter was brought to the attention of the parish council.

Blocked surface water drains

The parish council will ask Highways to clear the 'clogged up' drains in Main Road (near the Red Lion) and Maldon Road (in the vicinity of 'Affric') be cleared.

WAR MEMORIAL

Cllr Paoli-Burke reported a meeting will take place at the war memorial to discuss the positioning and material of the plaque to list the missing names.

VILLAGE POND

Cllr Wallace volunteered to remove the dipping platform. The availability of grant aid towards improving the pond is being explored.

THE BLACK BULL

It was confirmed the 'Asset to the village' forms had been submitted.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

It was reported there had been another flooding following an earlier leak of sewage into the filed. The parish council has reported this problem to Anglian Water using the emergency number.

It was confirmed there had been no new signs of drug abuse.

It was agreed the clerk would contact some of the allotment holders and give them until the end of April to tidy their allotments.

SWAN LANE

Cllr Wallace was thanked for removing the burnt-out car.

MARGARETTING TYE

Members of the Parish Council voted to proceed with the work to install the bollards on the green. Quotations for the work (materials and groundworks) will be sought and submitted for approval.

THREE MILE HILL

The missing manhole cover by the Hylands Park bus stop has been replaced. An email received from residents regarding the 'Blue Shed' will be forwarded to Highway's Enforcement Team.

VILLAGE HALL

Cllr Blurton reported the village hall funds were low. The Chelmer Room facilities needed redecorating and he would be putting together a specification Essex Association of Local Councils for this and for the redecoration of the main hall. The floor covering in the Chelmer Room will be replaced with sheet vinyl. This cost will be covered by Margaretting Friends. It was noted there is no longer a football club hire although £1,600 shortfall in revenue. the booking secretary had contacted Ingatestone to see if they would be interested in using the faculties.

VILLAGE SPRING CLEAN

This will take place on Saturday 4th April - 10.00am at Black Bull. (Since the meeting this has been cancelled.)

VILLAGE WEBSITE

Cllr Blurton reported on the closure of the Essex Info website. An application had been made and accepted to 'The Voice' website.

ACCOUNTS

Authority was given for payment of: Village Hall £452 (Contribution toward Insurance)

PLANNING - MARCH MEETING

The following decisions were noted 20/00097/FUL: Eweland Hall Lodge - Side and rear extensions. 20/00168/FUL: Eweland House -Retrospective application for existing concrete slab and ancillary outbuilding to be constructed on top.

Application granted

19/02071/FUL: Hill House, Writtle Road. Proposed demolition of existing double garage and erection of new double garage. Two storey rear extension and single storey side extension. Application granted

V E DAY - FRIDAY 8 MAY

(EALC) advised £8.12 per electorate is allowed to be spent on community events. The village hall, band, bar, fish and chip van, marquee have been booked. There is an estimated Cllr Paoli-Burke reported there had been one donation from the commu-

nity. Cllr Wallace reported he would approach the village hall committee to see if the 10% bar donation on the day could be waived. He also asked the parish council for £2,000 to cover the shortfall. Any money raised would go to the parish council. This proposal was unanimously agreed by all members of the parish council.

In line with a number of parish councils within the Chelmsford area, Margaretting meetings are not taking place for the foreseeable future.

MARGARETTING HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Competition Time - Dwarf French Bean - "Tendercrop" As a bit of fun we are giving each household two magic beans that will grow into lovely bean plants. This is a very reliable variety that give a high yield of fleshy round pods and perfect when eaten young. The best crops are produced when grown in well cultivated soil in a sunny position. Start off by planting in small pots with moist soil, covered with a clear polythene bag to keep warm, until the seedlings start showing after a week or two. Keep indoors until the weather is warmer then the beans can be transferred to a larger pot or direct into the ground outside and grown on with a cane for support until harvest. On Saturday 11th July 2020 before 10:30 am, bring your harvest along to the Horticultural Show in Margaretting Village Hall. Whoever is judged to have the best beans will win a prize. Plus, everyone gets to enjoy eating their own fresh beans.
