ST MARGARET'S CHURCH NEWS

Margaretting school, as a Church of England Primary School, has strong links with St Margaret's. In July each year the Year 6 children take part in a special service during the week they leave school. They are also presented with a leavers gift from the church. This year each Year 6 pupil received a Youth Bible as a leaving gift from the church. We would like to wish all Year 6 pupils every happiness and success in their new schools.

Since May this year members of the church support group committee and St Margaret's PCC have been following up the 2014 quinquennial list of repairs requiring attention. The most urgent of which has been a project to investigate and eliminate the cause of a large damp patch on one of the church walls. This particular project resulted in missing roof tiles being replaced, a new drain hopper installed and a section of an internal wall repaired and repainted.

MARGARETTING PARISH COUNCIL - JULY MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

One member of the public present. The issues raised and discussed were:

(i) Maldon Road - flooding

The continuing flooding problem in the vicinity of El Rita. It was noted when it rains the surface water now extends to the opposite side of the road. The parish council agreed to contact Cllr Grundy to see if he had received an update from Highways. He had agreed, at an earlier meeting, to raise this concern with Highways.

(ii) Main Road – old shell garage The recently installed new wire fencing and entrance gates to the site. The parish council confirmed it had not received any planning notices.

MALDON ROAD ALLOTMENTS There is one vacant allotment.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

Access. The details of the request for access, via the playing field, to the land backing onto the rear of the gardens for 3 to 8 Bank End were noted and discussed. Taking into consideration safety issues and the terms of the playing field lease it was agreed the parish council could not support this request.

Swings. Correspondence between the parish council and Sovereign's customer support team regarding the unsatisfactory repairs to the safety surface to the children's swing area was discussed. It was noted Sovereign's quotation/contract did not guarantee the repairs would not uplift. However, the parish council believes the repairs did not meet the repair specification.

MARGARETTING TYE GREEN

It was reported a bollard at the entrance to Van Dyke was removed when the house was being demolished. It has not been reinstalled.

MARGARETTING BROOK

The chairman reported the meeting with the Environment Agency on 14th June had proved useful.

The E.A. representatives had provided answers to the main questions raised.

Clearing the debris: The E.A. is not responsible for clearing the debris from Margaretting Brook. Keeping the brook clear of debris is the responsibility of the landowners with land adjoining or with the brook running through it. In some villages volunteers carry out this work. Details of the landowner's legal responsibilities can be found in an E.A. booklet 'Living on the Edge'. The parish council has a copy. Main Road flood risk. The E.A. will investigate re-establishing the flood alerts. The Red Lion and the houses opposite are located within the local floodplain and as such should receive free flood warning alerts. The E.A. does not provide sandbags. Although the City Council provides emergency aid to householders in the event of flooding it does not provide sandbags. Flood Alleviation Scheme. The E.A.

representatives were unaware of the E.A. and City Council's Flood Alleviation Scheme.

The idea of recruiting volunteers to keep Margaretting Brook clear was discussed. Once the vegetation growing along the edges of the brook had died down the parish council will undertake a survey to identify the spots in the brook that need clearing.

REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

Two of the three requested quotes have been received for the war memorial bollards and notice board work.

ACCOUNTS

There has been no recorded expenditure since the last meeting. Expenditure to date totals £4,259. Income to date totals £6,766 (£6,211 precept; £500 Maztec grant and £55 allotment rents).

A public road closure notice. Road works scheduled to take place within the next eighteen months in the High Street, Ingatestone. The road closure will be from the junction of The Furlongs to the Maldon Road crossroads. The notice takes effect 1 August 2017 and gives alternative routes. A copy of the notice is on the notice board.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The following planning decision was noted:

17/00679/FUL: Mole Hill Cottage, Margaretting Tye. First floor side extension and a single storey rear extension. Front porch roof to be lowered to make room for window along front elevation.

<u>Planning permission granted</u>

Two planning applications were received for comment at the planning meeting held on 3rd July.

17/00911/FUL: Peacock's Cottage, Main Road. Single storey side extension. Five roof lights to ground floor pitched roof.

17/00912/LBC: Peacock's Cottage, Main Road. Single storey side extension. Alterations to windows and doors to existing dwelling and five roof lights to ground floor pitched roof. Addition of window to rear elevation. Alterations to roof tiles to ground floor pitched roof. Internal alterations.
