#### **DEMOCRATIC TIME**

# Wantz Road

(i) Parking Problems. Parishioners were assured that the request for the protected junction markings for the entrance to the village hall was still in hand.

(ii) The Hawthorns. Concerns were raised about a planning application for the development of this site. Parishioners were advised that any objections to the planning application should be made direct to the City Council's Planning Department. (iii) The Oaks - Fly Tipping. It was reported that some large boulders had been placed on the grass verge outside this property. The parish council will follow up this report.

#### **Parsonage** Lane

(i) Railway Crossing. It was noted the gates have been repainted and were still unlocked.

(ii) Water Pipe Leak. The water leak problem is still unresolved due to a dispute between the landowner and the utility company.

## Main Road

Lamp post opposite Penny's Lane. This problem has been reported.

# DOG FOULING

In reality it shouldn't be a problem, you own a dog, it eats, it poos, you clean it up. Failing to do so is antisocial, smelly and can spread diseases. As well as being smelly dog mess is unhygienic and a health hazard. Dog mess can lead to Parvo, a potentially fatal disease, which is transferred between dogs, but the key health issue with dog faeces is that it can lead to toxocariasis in humans.

Toxocariasis can lead to serious illness and to blindness. It is caused by a parasite called Toxocara Canis also commonly referred to as Roundworm. The Toxocara Canis parasite lives in dogs' digestive systems and so dogs act as hosts for the parasite.
