

## THANK YOU

It's more than good to see our two pubs in Main Road open for business again. Margaretting owes a huge thank you to Julie at the Black Bull and Jon at the Red lion for keeping their pubs looking nice and well-kept throughout Covid. So many other village pubs looked unkempt and unloved during this time making their villages look uninviting and unsightly, but our village looks great!

## BEES IN THE TOWER

Margaretting church has had wild bees in the tower for at least 50 years – one colony in particular at the back of the tower would normally be particularly busy on a hot day; hundreds of bees coming and going at any time. Sadly the main colony seems to have died off this year, although the colony at the side of the tower is still going strong. Bees do get viruses as well as humans - currently central Essex is a 'hotspot' for a bee virus called EFB (European Foul Brood) which causes the grubs to die; adult worker bees (lifespan: about four months) don't get replaced as they come to the end of their lives, and quite suddenly the infected colony is all dead. The disease is spread mainly by drones (males) who tend to wander from colony to colony in search of a 'free lunch'. There is nothing much we can do about the dead bees as their nest is behind the oak weatherboarding. We hope that the other colony survives so there are still bees at the church.
