PARISH COUNCIL - NOVEMBER MEETING

DEMOCRATIC TIME

Two members of the public present. Flood Alleviation Scheme: Cllr Roy Whitehead's update on the current status of the scheme was postponed to our December meeting. We were assured more information would be available then. The Environment Agency has made an application to the court for a warrant to access private land in Margaretting - access to which is currently being denied by the landowner. A hearing is due to be held at Chelmsford Magistrates' Courts on Friday 21st November. We were advised that as this matter is in the hands of the court it is not unusual for dates to change.

VILLAGE PROJECTS

We are still waiting to receive ECC Highways' permissions for: Village Gateways; Maldon Road Lavender Bank and the Village Hall Road Traffic Sign.

VILLAGE POND

The vegetation surrounding the pond has been cut back. The Conservation Volunteers will inspect the pond on Tuesday, 24 November to advise on estimated time and costs to clear out the weed, leaves and debris. This group charges £200 per day.

VILLAGE TREES

Work on the weeping willow at The Tye, the cherry and silver birch in the Maldon Road Playing Field and the dead tree at the pond has been scheduled for Monday, 17 November.

VILLAGE BRIDLEWAYS

The removal of the bollard for Bridle Way 43 has been reported.

VILLAGE ROADS

ECC Highways will be monitoring-the flooding in Main Road (opposite the Red Lion) and in Maldon Road (Nunn's Crossing) on a quarterly basis. We plan to check the information concerning Maldon Road. Highways advised us that this particular drainage problem is due to blocked gullies but there are no road gullies in this vicinity.

All the pot holes previously reported have been inspected by Highways and marked up for repair. Although identified by red markings we understand there is no timescale for the repairs.

MALDON ROAD PLAYING FIELD

There were no reported incidents. We noted once again the views expressed by residents concerning the young people's request to install a skate board ramp at the far end of the field. We confirmed the residents would be consulted before any decision is made. The next step is to clarify exactly the size and style of ramp the young people have in mind.

PARISH OFFICE/ROOM

A telephone with an answering machine has been purchased and installed in the office. The office will be open on Saturdays 15th November and 20th December between 10.30am and 12 noon. A parish councillor will be present on those dates and times.
