Matters discussed and brought to our attention included: the poor response from the Environment Agency to this year's flooding in Main Road; flooding in Maldon Road in the vicinity of 'El Rita'; Network Rail's proposal to close the Parsonage Lane railway crossing; the planning application for a change of use of agricultural land in Church Lane and the Margaretting Flood Alleviation Scheme.
