

DEMOCRATIC TIME

No members of the public present. Before opening the meeting parish council members paid tribute to Cllr. Tony Smith who sadly passed away on 29 October.

IVY BARN LANE

Chelmsford City Council officers have found no evidence of waste materials being deposited at nos.1 and 2 Greens Cottages.

MAIN ROAD

Bus Shelter opposite Black Bull: Nothing further to report on the fencing installed in the grass verge.

MALDON ROAD

Playing Field: No reported incidents. Since the meeting it has been reported that a tent has been set up behind the youth shelter. The Police are aware.

Please warn your neighbours, particularly elderly or vulnerable neighbours, not to open the door to strangers or buy or sell on the doorstep. Some doorstep callers may offer poor quality goods at inflated prices and if a caller is not genuine, they may be gathering information for future crime. Please keep in mind that if cold callers don't get any sales in Maragetting, they are less likely to return.

100 Hearts for 100 Years

The children of Margaretting Primary School have been learning the history behind the Sweetheart Pincushions of World War 1. They learnt that recuperating soldiers and sailors would make the hearts to send home to loved ones as a token of love asking that they were not forgotten. This was also a way of distracting them from the war, their injuries and death. The older children sewed and decorated their hearts putting thought into their designs using flowers to represent peace or the gardens back home, buttons the colour of the uniforms, ribbons for their bravery and poppies for remembrance. The sequins are to reflect the light so that their light continues to shine and we will not forget them!







We hope the hearts made by the children of Margaretting C of E School are enjoyed by all who visit the church. The school is very proud of the children for their work. The children loved hearing the history behind why the soldiers and sailors made the hearts and this helped them decide on how to decorate them. The red and white hearts were made by children aged 7-9 years. The older children, 9-11 year olds, made the burgundy and cream hearts. The other four rows on the wall were made by the school's 4-7 year olds.
